

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Cwmbran Celtic welcome Carmarthen Town to Celtic Park for our first home Cyrmu South game of the 2023-24 season.

Celtic first played Carmarthen Town, then in the Welsh Premier League, in a pre-season friendly at Cwmbran Stadium in July 2014 which was a 1-1 draw, teenager Alex McDowell scoring the Celtic goal. Later that season, Celtic winger Chris Ham joined Town but his time there was short-lived and he returned to Celtic the following season. Josh Bull also had a short spell there in 2019/20.

Having been relegated from the Welsh Premier League in the Covid truncated season 2019/20 after 24 years in the top flight, Carmarthen met Celtic in the Cymru South at Celtic Park in September 2021. Celtic took the lead, Tom Meehan converting Josh Hinwood's cross on 48 minutes but a scrambled equaliser by Lee Surman in the 89th minute denied Celtic the 3 points. Carmarthen were easy 3-0 winners of the return game at Richmond Park. Celtic stand-in keeper Andrew Larcombe had a magnificent game between the sticks without his saves the score might have reached double figure such was Town's dominance. Last season the teams met 3 times. Each game was a goalfest with 22 goals being scored in total. In the home league match Celtic took a 2-goal lead through an Alex Bonthron penalty and a strike from Isaac Powell. However they were swept aside by a 5-goal blitz from the West Walians before Bonthron scored a 3rd goal for Celtic in the closing minutes. In the 3rd round of the Welsh Cup, again at Celtic Park, Celtic won a topsy turvy thriller 4-3. Shaun Moss opened the scoring but the visitors fought back to lead 2-1. However a red card and the resultant penalty by Alex Bonthron levelled the scores. Another red card reduced Carmarthen to 9 men and Bonthron gave Celtic the lead. However the visitors salvaged an equaliser in the 70th minute through their old adversary Greg Walters. Then Shaun Moss was sent off but Celtic scrambled the winner in time added on when Andrew Hewitt scooped a cross from Tom Meechan over the keeper's head.

In the return game at Carmarthen, the home side were well on top going into the closing minutes 4-1 ahead but Celtic gave them a fright with two late goals from Jordan Meaney and substitute Luke Archer to give a more respectable final score of 3-4. Tom Meechan scored Celtic's first goal.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CARMARTHEN TOWN

The club was formed in 1948 and admitted to the Carmarthenshire Association Football League. The present ground, Richmond Park, was created in 1952. Election to the Welsh League came in 1953 with the club gaining its first honours in 1959-60 with promotion from Division 2 West to the First Division of the Welsh League.

Progress was patchy in the 70's and 80's with intermittent promotion and relegation in the Welsh League Divisions until the 1995-96 season. This was the best season in the club's history so far with both the Welsh League title and the Cyril Rogers Cup coming to Carmarthen - a notable double.

The following season 1996-97 was the club's first in the League of Wales and impressive progress was made, notably in terms of improving their league position in each of the next four seasons. Initially this was achieved under the management of John Mahoney before he was replaced by Tomi Morgan in November 1998.

Significantly, Carmarthen's 3rd place finish in the league at the end of the 2000-01 season ensured their qualification for the UEFA Intertoto Cup, an honour that had been denied them only on goal difference the previous season.

The UEFA Cup tie against Swedish giants AIK Stockholm was a significant landmark in the history of the club and Town's first European adventure. A place in the UEFA Cup was Carmarthen's reward as losing finalists in the Welsh Cup and a very attractive draw against Eircom League outfit Longford Town an 2-0 defeat in the away tie was spectacularly overturned a fortnight later at Latham Park, Newtown when Town demolished Longford 5-1 securing the highest score, at that time, of any Welsh club in European competitions.

In the 2005-06 domestic season Town were once more involved in a FAW Premier Cup campaign with an exciting win over Cardiff and, subsequently, a narrow semi-final defeat against Swansea City in front of a packed Richmond Park record crowd (1800). Ahead of the 2006-07 Welsh Premier League season Carmarthen had been drawn to play Finland's Tampere United but there was to be no repeat of the previous year's European euphoria.

In the Premier Cup they reached the quarter-final stage only to suffer a narrow 3-2 defeat against Cardiff City. And they reached the same stage in the League Cup before Caersws won by a single goal. But in the Welsh Cup they negotiated that stage, just, by defeating Porthmadog on penalties after extra-time before a narrow 1-0 semi-final victory over Llanelli secured a place in the final for the third time in the club's history.

Having lost on both earlier occasions, Town at last secured the famous trophy by overcoming local rivals Afan Lido 3-2 with goals from Kaid Mohamed (2) and Sasha Walters in Stebonheath Park, Llanelli – and, as a consequence, a fourth European campaign was guaranteed.

For the first time, much due to an ongoing programme of infrastructure and building improvements, Carmarthen were at last able to host their UEFA Cup tie at Richmond Park – but sadly Norwegian giants SK Brann spoiled the occasion by demonstrating the gulf between the teams with an 8-0 victory.

The 2013-14 season began with the 'unveiling' of the new changing-rooms complex, the latest of the ongoing programmed improvements at Richmond Park. And on the field Town's performances were similarly impressive gaining a final third place finish. Carmarthen also found success in the League Cup for the second successive season.

The Old Gold began the 2019-20 season with much the same squad that had finished the previous campaign although Luke Cummings and Mael Davies were notable departures – however several new signings with mainly Welsh League experience were added.

For several seasons Town had struggled badly to be competitive during the initial stages of the League programme and this season was no exception. After 13 matches they were without a win and bottom of the League with just 4 points – and by this time Neil Smothers had stepped down from the post of Manager with Danny Thomas taking over for a short spell. At this stage the club decided to appoint former Swansea City player Kristian O'Leary as Manager with Chris Llewellyn alongside him in the role of Coach.

But, of course, the 2019-20 playing season was never completed due to the global pandemic and subsequently the FAW made the decision that Carmarthen Town, in eleventh place in the League at that time, should be relegated.

Accordingly, the club's tenure of the top tier of Welsh football (League of Wales/Welsh Premier League/ Cymru Premier League) for the past 24 seasons was regrettably over — a new chapter in the life of Carmarthen Town Football Club now unfolds under Sean Cresser as manager, assisted by the returning Mark Aizlewood as head coach.

VIEW FROM THE STAND

As the new season approaches it has been heartening to see how many youth players are vying for places in the Celtic senior sides. Kian Bodenham is a fixture in the 1st team. Lewis McCauley and Luke Archer are on the fringes whilst 16 year olds Gabriel Howells and Alfie Foster made their debuts as substitutes in the MG Cup match against Taffs Well. In the Reserves, a number of players from last season's double winning Torfaen Under 16s are pushing for inclusion.

Cwmbran Celtic had high expectations of introducing several of its highly promising Under 19 Development squad this season but this was dashed by the FAW's pre-season decision to axe the club from its Academy set-up. The official reason given was that the club had failed to meet the required on and off the field standards to even achieve the lowest C band status. However, when the BBC broadcast the howls of protests from the 5 clubs who were jettisoned, an FAW spokesman let the cat out of the bag – the real reason was that the FAW had decided to streamline the number of Academies. Their only justification for this was that England had only 50 Academies compared with Wales 25. This was a kick in the teeth for Celtic, who, in the months leading up to the judgement day, had designated two personnel to spend an inordinate amount of time addressing the purported gaps in the Celtic model to ensure that its Academy status was preserved.

At a meeting 5 weeks prior to the decision date the FAW informed the 25 clubs with Academies that, at that date, half of them would not achieve re-selection. It is hard to accept that, virtually overnight, half a dozen or more clubs suddenly pulled out all the stops to ensure re-selection. Furthermore, our club representatives were told that had they been on board earlier the club would have succeeded in its application. My belief is that these were empty platitudes bearing in mind that we now know there was a pre-determined decision to reduce the number of Academies.

Of the 5 rejected clubs, three were from south-east Wales: Taffs Well, Risca and Cwmbran Celtic. If the prime objective of having Academies is to improve the quality of young players, Risca should have walked the process. They not only ran highly successful teams in the older age groups but also introduced a plethora of youth players into their two senior sides. It is truly staggering that they were not even awarded C status – one has to question the official line that the selection process was done on merit. The FAW's decision means that there are now no accredited Academies east of Cardiff. Aspiring youngsters will now have to travel long distances or join the English-based Academies at Newport or over the border. The FAW's attitude about this is that they don't have a problem because the best players will later graduate to the national sides to the overall benefit of football in Wales.

So what has happened to Celtic's Under 19 Development squad? They wanted to stay together so have transferred to Merthyr Town. This is a club which is based in the English pyramid which was given special dispensation last season to run an Under 19 Development side which finished bottom of the league. Merthyr have been upgraded to C status and so the incoming ex-Celtic squad will presumably push out the not so talented boys whose side finished bottom last season. The decision to choose Merthyr at the expense of Celtic and others appears to be highly political – an opportunity to try and entice Merthyr back, the club having allegedly "expressed an interest" in joining the FAW's jurisdiction.

Cwmbran Celtic put in a robust appeal as did the other clubs, but all to no avail. The die was already well and truly cast. To add insult to injury, by the time the appeal was heard, several players and the management from our two best sides had committed themselves elsewhere because trials were in progress and squads for the new season were already being selected.

Looking forward, although it is a big blow to lose the Academy, Celtic takes heart from its tradition of having a strong grass roots ethic which will provide the very best players the opportunity to progress into the first team. Furthermore, being the top club in Gwent by virtue of its continuing Cymru South status, the club is able to offer opportunities to talented young players from elsewhere as has been the case with Kian Bodenham, Harrison Lewis and Iwan Hooper.

For the avoidance of doubt, this article expresses my own opinion on the Academy situation. It does not represent the views of the club.

MATCH REPORT: GOYTRE UNITED 2 - 3 CWMBRAN CELTIC (27-Jul)

Cwmbran Celtic pulled off a stunning win in the opening game of the Cymru South season at Goytre, Lewis Iles scoring the winner in the 6th minute of time added on to take his team to the top of the table albeit only for 24 hours.

Celtic were again slow out of the blocks as they were against Taffs Well last Saturday and they were indebted to 2 fine saves by Hooper and a clearance off the line by Josh Hinwood to keep their goal intact. However on 17 minutes Kian Bodenham was adjudged to have handled the ball and Watts scored from the spot. Celtic drew level on 29 minutes when Alex Bonthron ghosted into the box to convert a Tom Meechan cross at the near post. In the 2nd half Hooper made another great save to keep out a wayward clearance by Hinwood. Celtic took the lead in the 67th minute when a Meechan cross eluded the defender to find lles who coolly lobbed the keeper to give Celtic the lead. Goytre equalised in the 73rd minute with a header from Edwards. Hooper was adamant that he scooped the ball off the line but the referee ruled that the goal stood. On 84 minutes Celtic were awarded a penalty but McFenton made a fine save to deny Iles – the striker's 2nd miss in a week from the spot. Celtic were well on top in the closing minutes and were rewarded when Iles found himself free in the 6-yard box to take a cross from Alex Bonthron and calmly place the ball into the net for the last gasp winner.

What a great send-off for me as I depart to pastures new on the back of circa 500 games as Celtic's intrepid match reporter. A big thankyou to all the players and management who have given me so much pleasure watching their exploits over the past 17 seasons.

The visitors fielded a much-changed team from last season's line up and they were much the sharper side in the 1st half in which Celtic managed to keep the score goalless thanks to two clearances off the line and two fine saves by debutant keeper Iwan Hooper. Celtic could have taken the lead early in the 2nd half, a Taffs clearance bouncing off their own bar and Lewis Iles's 'goal' being ruled out for a very harsh foul challenge. Hooper rescued Celtic with two more great saves but Taffs struck a double blow with two goals in quick succession by Daniels (51) and Treharne (54). Celtic looked down and out as the clock ran down and they emptied their bench more to give the substitutes a run-out rather than expecting to save the game. However, in 10 minutes of time added on by referee Ben Schofield the subs turned up trumps, 16-year-old debutant striker Gabriel Howells stabbing the ball home (90+4) and defender Andrew Hewitt, pushed up front, latching on to a through ball to hit the net past the shell-shocked Taffs defence (90+9).

In the penalty shoot-out keeper Ed King made two fine saves from Alex Bonthron and Andrew Larcombe and Lewis Iles shot over the bar. Taffs converted all 3 of their spot kicks to win the tie. Gabriel Howells, a product of the now defunct Academy, became the youngest ever Celtic scorer in the Welsh League era age 16 years 236 days. Iwan Hooper was Celtic's man of the match.



CWMBRAN CELTIC – OUTLOOK FOR THE NEW SEASON

Having finished in 8th place in the Cymru South league last season – an improvement of 5 places from 2022/23, manager James Kinsella wants his team to push on for at least a top six finish this season. He has not been particularly active in the transfer market in the close season – its always difficult for a club like ours with a relatively small budget to recruit players of sufficient calibre to augment the existing squad. Goalkeeper Iwan Hooper has signed and, in the absence of Lewis Watkins with a hand injury, he has put in excellent performances in the opening two competitive games such that there is going to be fierce competition between the two keepers for the no 1 spot.

The club has received a huge boost with the return of prolific striker Alex Bonthron from his half season at Merthyr. He will resume his partnership with last season's top scorer Lewis lles upfront – probably vying with Briton Ferry's Luke Bowen and Tom Walters as the best strike partnership in the league. Ferry have signed Celtic's career top scorer Josh Bull who can only currently command a place on the bench!

Celtic are short of numbers in central defence with the departure of Josh Rippon to the States, the retirement of Jordan Meaney and the impending departure to New Zealand of Andrew Hewitt. That leaves just Harrison Lewis as a bona fide centre back. He gave us a scare in a friendly at Blaenavon when he dislocated a finger but fortunately it only kept him out for one match. Versatile skipper Andrew Larcombe had been Harrison's partner at the back for the time being. Right back Kian Bodenham can also play in the back three formation.

Josh Hinwood has returned from his brief sojourn at Croesyceiliog and has immediately forced his way into the starting line-up at left back with some fine pre-season performances. This has allowed Celtic to keep the evergreen Dominic Connor in his best position on the left of midfield. Celtic are expecting big things from their young bucks in centre midfield — Isaac Powell and Elliott Jones. There is serious competition in the middle of the park with the experienced pair of Shaun Moss and Alex McDowell, Jack Martin coming back from serious injury, and Tyler Broom, all seeking to play behind Celtic's talisman playmaker Tom Meechan.

Looking at the early results in the Cymru South, the favourites Briton Ferry are already in top spot on goal difference followed on goal difference by Afan Lido and Ammanford whose new signing Mark Jones rocked Abertillery Bluebirds with a late 2nd half hat-trick in midweek. At the bottom of the table last season's 13th placed team Trefelin look destined for another tough season, having conceded 9 goals in their opening two games. Gwent rivals Abegavenny Town and Abertillery Bluebirds are also winless.
