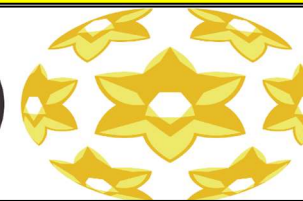

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

This afternoon we extend a warm welcome to Llantwit Major. Champions in 2021/22, Major failed to meet the FAW's criteria to gain promotion to the Premier League and as a consequence they lost manager Karl Lewis and several players in last year's close season and last found themselves bottom of the league with only one point from their opening 6 games. However, they recovered well and finished a creditable 7th in the Cymru South table, 7 points and one place ahead of Celtic.

Llantwit joined the Welsh League in 2012/13 having been promoted as South Wales Amateur League champions. After four undistinguished years in the 3rd division they clicked in 2016/17 winning the title. In 2017/18 they won the 2nd division title to equal Monmouth Town as the only other club in the modern era to have achieved successive championships in divisions 2 and 3. In 2018/19 they held their own in Division 1 finishing in 7th place and in the covid truncated season 2019/20 they were 11th.

Celtic and Llantwit Major first met in the last season of the Welsh League division 1 in September 2018 on a windy and rainy afternoon at the Windmill Ground. Celtic snatched victory through a Chris Ham goal in the 8th minute. A superb performance from goalkeeper Rhys Picton on his Celtic debut denied the hosts a point. Llantwit gained revenge in the return game in January 2019 at Celtic Park, winning 4-2 against a Celtic team ravaged by injury. Celtic started without their two regular centre backs, Rhys Williams (suspended) and Niall Yeates (stopped playing) and then at half time they lost their replacement pairing of Rakesh Patel and Luke Jones. Debutant right back Kallum Hajgato also had to go off. Chris Ham scored both Celtic goals.

In 2019/20 Llantwit won 2-0 at Celtic Park but Celtic won the spoils in the away game 2-1 through Louis Feeley and a Chris Ham penalty. In the opening league fixture of 2021-22 Llantwit won 2-0 at the Windmill Ground. In the closing last day fixture at Celtic Park the newly crowned champions stretched their unbeaten run to 13 games with a 5-0 win. Celtic needed the results of two fellow strugglers to go their way. Ammanford won and Risca were 1-0 ahead into the 2nd half at Afan Lido at which point Celtic were going down. However Lido scored twice late on which allowed Celtic to finish 13th and to escape relegation. There were dual celebrations at the Celtic club after the match.

Last season two goals by Alex Bonthron (one a penalty) gave Celtic their 1st win of the season 2-0. In October Celtic looked like being dumped out of the Welsh Cup when Major were 2 up midway through the 2nd half, however Lewis lles pulled a goal back and in time added on Bonthron equalised from the penalty spot. Celtic duly won the penalty shoot-out 3-0 thanks to 2 great saves by keeper Joe Regan. In the return league game at Celtic Park Llantwit avenged their two defeats with a 2-1 win. Lewis lles scored Celtic's goal.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2023

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emllyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5 -1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the

runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. Last season Celtic finished a creditable 8th in the table.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF LLANTWIT MAJOR

Llantwit Major Football Club was formed in 1962. A selection committee selected the team until entry to the South Wales Amateur League 2nd division was gained in 1971. Life Member Gwyn John was appointed as the first team manager. Manager John's team were promoted to the 1st Division after finishing second in the 1976/77 season. Llantwit consolidated in the division before claiming their first Amateur League title under new manager Alan Foster in the 79/80 season. This was closely followed by their second championship just a year later after retaining the title and adding the Corinthian Cup to achieve the double. This kick started a golden period in the 80's where the club won another double of league and Corinthian Cup in 83/84. The hat-trick of Corinthian Cups came in the 86/87 season. The club were also runners up in the league on a further two occasions during the decade. The 90's by contrast was a very mixed period for the club, first relegation in 91/92 under Rob Sherman's leadership, followed by promotion two years later with Steve Manning at the helm. Fast forward two years and relegation, this time with record appearance holder Pete Lingham as player/manager. However, the club made sure they were in the first division again at the turn of the millennium, the management duo of Kev Pycroft and Phil Clay gaining promotion by winning a comfortable 2nd division title. The club spent the next decade consistently flirting with the league title without ever looking like serious title contenders with Llantwit stalwarts Tim Watts and John Guy providing much needed stability in charge. The club also came runners up in the Corinthian Cup in 2005. John Guy stepped down as manager in 2010 following a decade as manager to move upstairs as Chairman. Guy did this selflessly in order to allow the introduction of fresh ideas into the club from new boss Kevin Rees in partnership with Watts. Rees and Watts introduced fresh blood into the playing staff gaining instant success by lifting the SWFA Senior Cup in 2010/11.

The bedrock of the new players was Darren Robinson who became player-manager along with the irrepressible Watts and Leigh Pratt as player-coach. In his first season (2011/12), the club went onto win the South Wales Amateur League losing only once in the process before securing promotion to the Welsh League Division 3 after beating Sully Sports 4-0 in a play-off final. Following a respectable debut season in Div 3 where the club faded in the final weeks of the season to finish 6th, Robinson stepped down from his managerial duties due to personal reasons. Over the next two seasons Baz Whitlam, Dave Peniket and Phil Clay all contributed to stabilising the club in what became a challenging period with several local players finishing playing for different reasons and the club fighting to retain their Welsh League status. Over the summer months of 2014, the club were quick to act in appointing Karl Lewis as manager, having become available following two highly successful years managing in the Welsh League Reserve and Youth Leagues. Three years on, and only ten league defeats within this period, Lewis has superbly led the club to back-to-back league titles winning the Welsh League Div 3 title in 2016/17 and Welsh League Div 2 title in 2017/18 in the club's most successful period since forming. The club will now look forward to competing in Welsh League Division 1 and the second tier of the Welsh Football Domestic Pyramid System for the first time in its history. After Karl Lewis resigned as manager after a successful season in the Welsh League, Darren Robinson became the new manager to guide Llantwit Major AFC into the next chapter playing in the JD Cymru South.

Karl Lewis was only gone for a few months and came back to take the club on and finish mid-table before the season was curtailed in the 2019/20 season.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 0 - 1 CARMARTHEN TOWN (12-Aug)

We entertained Carmarthen Town in our first home game of the new season. Carmarthen were until recently regular members of the Cymru Premier League and were sure to provide stiff opposition. The early exchanges were fairly even but the first real chance fell to Celtic when, following a good driving run from Tom Meechan, the ball fell for Lewis Iles but his shot was comfortably blocked by the Carmarthen defenders. Soon after Dom Connor was in action down the left and created a chance for Tom Meachen but again the visitor's defence was able to block his shot. Just after Tom scuffed a half volley following a corner and the ball went harmlessly wide of the goal. Carmarthen had their first real chance on the half hour when Dyson won a race with Harrison Lewis and hit his shot well but Iwan Hooper was able to save going low to his left. Just before half time a long ball forward caught the wind and deceived Iwan who had come off his line to collect it. Fortunately, he was able to scamper back and palm the ball away to safety, Iwan was in action immediately after - saving a shot from Daley.

Carmarthen began the second half in a more determined manner and began to dominate the game. Their captain, Greg Walters, was becoming more influential and dominating mid-field. After 70 minutes Iwan Hooper was again called into action when Langley just beat Harrison Lewis to a through ball and forced him into another crucial save. Kian Bodenham then broke through on goal but, yet again, his shot was blocked before bothering Idzi in the visitor's goal. Carmarthen continued to threaten and it took two great challenges by Dom Connor to stop them getting a shot on goal. It came as no surprise when the Visitors took the lead in the 72nd minute. Mason Jones-Thomas cut in from the left, dribbled past two defenders and hit a fierce low shot which went in off Hooper's near post. Right on full time young Hooper was called on again. With Celtic pushing forward looking for an equaliser, Langley broke free to run at goal from the halfway line but Iwan was quick off his line and smothered the shot.
