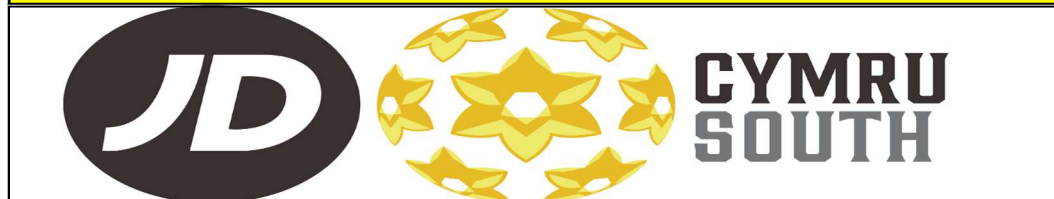

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Today we extend a warm welcome to Caerau (Ely) who were promoted this season as champions of the Ardal South-West league. The teams have played each other 20 times, 16 in the Welsh League and twice each in the Cymru South and in the Welsh Cup. In 2007/8 in the Welsh League 2nd Division Celtic lost 3-4 at Cwrt-yr-Ala, their goals by Ben Evans, Craig Cheedy and Sam Winter. Player-manager Mickey Copeman got a straight red. In the return Celtic, fielding 8 teenagers, won 3-1 through goals by Evans, Jamie Parsons and Luke Sallis. In 2008/9 we won the home game 3-0, Owen Llewellyn, Scot Lanyon and Sean Matthews scoring. In the end of season return we were thrashed 2-6 after going 2-0 up through 2 goals from Lanyon. Celtic were short of players that night so sponge man Mike Baugh aged 45 made his only Welsh League appearance.

In 2009/10 Caerau did the double, winning 2-1 at Celtic Park, Dale Howarth scoring for Celtic, and winning 3-0 in the last game of the season which cost Celtic the 2nd Division championship and secured promotion for Caerau in 3rd place. In 2010/11, in the 1st Division, the teams fought out two draws, 0-0 away and 3-3 at home, Llewellyn 2 and Kesh Patel scoring, Luke Jones making his debut. In 2011/12 Celtic did the double, 2-1 away thanks to goals by Llewellyn and Shane Williamson, and 3-1 at Celtic Park, Dominic Connor 2 and Nana Baah scoring.

In 2013/14 Caerau won both matches 2-1, Connor scoring the Celtic goals in both games. Celtic were relegated at the end of that season. In 2014/15 Caerau won 2-0 at Celtic Park in the Welsh Cup. In 2016/17 newly promoted Celtic played out a classic top of the table 2-2 draw at Cwrt-Yr-Ala. Celtic took a 2 goal lead through goals by Chris Ham but 2 goals from Lloyd Toghil in the last 5 minutes rescued a point for Caerau. James Young made his Celtic debut in that game The return was a goalfest, Celtic winning 6-4 with goals from Josh Bull (3), Niall Yeates 2 and Lloyd Kinsella.

In 2017/18 Celtic won the league fixture at Cwrt-yr-Ala 5-0 with a hat-trick from Chris Ham including two penalties, and a brace from Josh Bull. Two weeks later we returned to play Caerau in the Welsh Cup and won 1-0 with a goal in the closing minutes by Josh Bull. In the league game at Celtic Park we won 2-0 through 2 goals by Lewis Iles. Caerau were relegated that season but were back in the newly formed Cymru South for season 2019/20. Celtic won 2-0 at home thanks to goals from Ham (penalty) and Niall Yeates. The return game was vital, both sides being in the bottom 3. Celtic recovered from 1-0 down to win 2-1, the goals from Lewis Sommers and a Ham penalty. The win took Celtic above Taffs Well into 13th place and safety as the season ended there because of the covid pandemic.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2023

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5 -1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the

runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. Last season Celtic finished a creditable 8th in the table.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CAERAU (ELY)

Caerau Ely were formed in 1955 joining the junior division of the Cardiff Combination League. A set of red jerseys given to the club by Mr. Ron Miller of Cross Bros. AFC was to determine the colours of the club forever. The club started its playing days on the Ely Racecourse moving on to Glyn Derw School in the eighties and then finally moving onto the Cwrt-yr-Ala ground in Ely.

In 1991 they gained entry to the new Senior League and then progressed to the CC Sports Welsh League in 1998 after beating Dinas Powys 1-0 in the play-off held at Bridgend.

The history shows that after winning well over eighty combined league titles and cups in its time, Caerau Ely has become one of the most successful clubs in Cardiff.

Season 04/05 the club gained promotion from the 3rd Division to the 2nd finishing in the third place, they carried on surviving near the bottom and scraping to safety at the end of most seasons, with most players leaving their best days behind them, the club realised they had to look at the future.

Season 06/07 saw the coming together of Caerau Ely and the youth of Llanishen Dons football club. Caerau without a representative side in the youth league approached Llanishen to invite them to join the Caerau set up. The advantages for Llanishen were obvious in that they could play at a very good level and the advantages for Caerau were that they would have a new group of young players for the future.

The first season saw the youngsters finish third in the East division and also saw a number of players move up and take their place in the senior side, the next season they finished second with even more of a presence in the first side.

Season 09/10 was the biggest in the club's history ending in promotion to Division One, winning 8 drawing 2 and with 1 loss in the last 11 games they took third place. On times the club played with a starting eleven that did not have a player over the age of 21, so the youth policy adopted in 06/07 had finally paid off.

The first Season in Division One went very well, with the club finishing with a respectful fifth place, which was the club's highest finish in their history and a great achievement. The second season the club came up very short, with major problems trying to keep hold of players and discipline on and off the pitch returning to days the club thought they had moved on from. They finished bottom of the league.

Caerau Ely started the 2012–13 season back in Division Two after a short but eye opening period in the first division. The club employed a new team Manager in Nana Baah, who was helped by Giles Smith and Dominic Broad to try and rebuild the team.

In their first season in charge, they managed to work wonders and gain promotion back into Division One and in the process creating a new professional approach at the club. Discipline at the club was of a very good standard and major improvements have been made under the management of Nana Baah.

In 2014–15 Caerau won the Welsh League Division One title and were runners up in the league cup losing to Taff's Well A.F.C. at Jenner Park.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 0 - 3 PENYBONT (14-Oct)

The Magic of the Welsh Cup came rolling into Cwmbran as last year's Semi Finalists and the 21/22 runners up Premier League Penybont arrived at the Motor Park Arena for the second round of this year's competition. On a crisp early Autumn afternoon there was certainly the feel of a big game in the air as the Motor Park filled up earlier than this reporter has seen it as there was hope of a famous Cup upset.

Celtic made three changes from the 4-1 victory away to Abertillery Bluebirds as Kian Bodenham, Josh Rippon and Lewis Illes came in for Shaun Moss, Harrison Lewis and Thomas Meechan.

Kick off came after all the pageantry of a cup tie which included both sides being walked onto the pitch by mascots from the Celtic youth teams. After all that the game started with both teams showing all the energy needed to contest a one-off knockout game and in fact Celtic made the better of the early stages and won the first corner of the match but failed to make anything of it.

Not long after and the nerves of the hosts maybe started to show as there was a mix up between Watkins and the defence forced the ball to be cleared for a corner which almost saw the deadlock broken early when the inswinging corner took not one but two headers before going just over the bar.

Penybont then started to show their class as they continued attacking and looked dangerous as they had a great chance after having a move down the right where the visitors found space and played a long pass into the box where the Penybont striker tries to grab the ball but slipped before he could tap the ball home and Cwmbran managed to clear the ball.

The hosts then went behind in the seventeenth minute under controversial circumstances, when Gabriel Kircough headed a left sided corner towards goal but Watkins believed he had saved on the line. However the referee disagreed and decided the ball had crossed the line, Watkins' vocal disagreement with the officials earned the keeper a yellow card.

There was much confusion in the ground as to who exactly had scored the opening goal and in fact by the time the scorer had been identified the ball was back in the net again just six minutes later and in fact this reporter was updating his notes with the first scorers name so I missed that second goal sorry people but I do know that the scorer was the impressive Keyon Reffell.

Those two goals coming in quick succession seemed to suck the air out of the ground the team as Celtic started to misplace more passes and despite a few half chances towards the end of the half the break came with the visitors two-nil ahead and looking comfortable.

To show how comfortable the Premier League side were feeling, at the start of the second half they replaced their top scorer Chris Venables with a player half his age, Lewys Morgan. *Continued on next page*

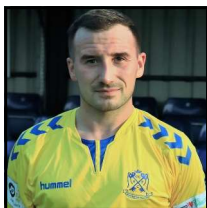

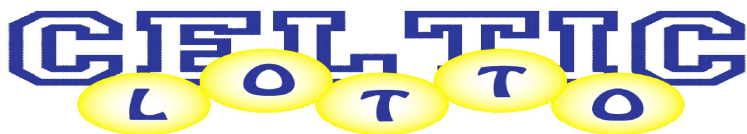
