WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

We welcome Taffs Well to Celtic Park for the 2nd time this season. In July in the opening fixture in the 1st round of the MG Cup. The Wellmen were cruising to victory 2-0 ahead into time added on but goals from Gabriel Howells and Andrew Hewitt forced a penalty shootout which Taffs won 3-0.

The teams first met in Celtic's 1st season in Welsh League Division 1 following their promotion in 2010. The game, on 8 January 2011, ended 7 weeks inactivity for Celtic, having not played since 20 November 2010. Celtic, managed by Ben Graham, were on a 10 match run of just one win and 9 defeats. However the lay-off affected Taffs Well more because Celtic won 6-0 with goals from Shane Williamson 2, Luke Sallis 2, Lloyd Davies and Chris Pearce. Alas the win only proved to be a brief respite as Celtic then went a further 6 games without a win and Taffs Well easily won the return 3-0. Despite this horrendous mid-season spell, Celtic rallied in the run-in to retain their 1st Division status.

In 2011/12, Celtic, managed by Taffs Well old boy Gareth Morgan, were well beaten 3-0 home and away. Gareth was sent off in the away game. There was another double for Taffs in 2012/13, 2-0 at Celtic Park and 2-1 at Taffs where Lee Challenger scored for Celtic from the penalty spot. Season 2013-14 brought Taffs their 5th successive win in this fixture, 1-0 at the Rhiw Dd'ar Stadium, but Celtic broke the run in the return with a 2-1 win in a red-blooded encounter. Taffs skipper Lee Williams and vocal manager Lee Bridgman were both sent off. Despite this, the 10-men visitors took the lead through Marcus Jones. Challenger equalised when the keeper spilled the ball and Celtic won in the 93rd minute when another error from the keeper resulted in an own goal off a desperate lunge to clear the ball by a defender. At the end of the season Celtic were relegated as the 4th from bottom team to make way for demoted Welsh Premier side Afan Lido.

In 2016/17, with Celtic back in the top tier, Taffs were rocked at Celtic Park by the first half sending off of central defender Cortez Belle, and they were then swamped by a superb attacking spell which put the home side 4-0 up at half time. Chris Ham scored 2, the second a sensational goal after a typical mazy run from midfield. Josh Bull and Owen Cook were the other scorers and the game ended 4-0 to put Celtic top of the league. Celtic's final game of the season at Rhiw Dd'ar saw them go down 1-0 despite having much of the game.

In 2017/18 Celtic won 1-0 at home, Rhys Williams scoring against his old club, but the away game was the same old story – a 3-0 defeat on one of our bogey grounds. In 2018/19 Celtic ended a sequence of 6 successive away defeats against the Wellmen with a fine 3-0 win with goals by Bull, Ham and Callum Wakeham. In the return at Celtic Park a 2-1 win completed the double, Bull scoring both goals. In 2019/20, in the Cymru League, Celtic won 2-0 at Celtic Park, the goals by Jordan Clarke and Niall Yeates. The return was not played because the season was ended early by the covid outbreak.

In 2021/22 the teams drew 3-3 at Taffs Well. Lewis Iles 2 (including a penalty) and Tom Meechan looked to have gained the 3 points for Celtic but the hosts equalised in the last minute of time added on. In the return, Taffs were easy winners 3-0. Last season Taffs won 4-3 at Celtic Park, Lewis Iles (2) and Taylor Davies scored for Celtic. Celtic ran riot in the return winning 5-1 with goals by Lewis Iles (4) and Isaac Powell. Lewis certainly likes playing the Wellmen – 8 goals in the past 2 seasons.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2023

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2023 (continued)

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emllyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5 -1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the

runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. Last season Celtic finished a creditable 8th in the table.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF TAFFS WELL

Following the end of World War II, Elan Gough and Bill Newman initiated the idea of merging local clubs to improve the facilities and playing standards than experienced pre-war. This idea was warmly welcomed and Taffs Well AFC was born. The Club was a key member of the South Wales Amateur League.

After a successful initial period, Bill Newman passed away and the Club faced a difficult time. In 1960, Don James joined the Club as Secretary. The determination of Don and many others resulted in a change of fortunes for the team both on and off the pitch. Don has now been with the Club for 62 years and his fantastic efforts were rewarded in 2014 as the main stand was renamed the "Don James Stand".

Success followed and the Club won the South Wales Amateur League First Division in 1975, 1976 and 1977 as well as South Wales Intermediate Cup in 1975 and 1977. The Club entered the Welsh League in 1977. Malcolm Frazer joined the Club the same year and his hard work was recognised in 2017 with the unveiling of a new stand brandishing his name. In 1996 Norma Samuel became the Club's Secretary having previously been a committee member and has been another tremendous servant ever since.

Under the management of our now Chairman, Lee Bridgeman, the Clubs' most successful spell in recent times saw the Club finish Division One runners up in 2011-12 and 2012-13 and winning the Nathaniel MG Cup four times in five seasons; 2011-12, 2012-13, 2014-2015 and 2015-16. In 2018-19 Taffs Well Youth side won the Welsh League Youth Division and in 2021-22 our development team won the South Wales and National Development Championships.

The revised JD Cymru South began in 2019 and we have remained in the league since. In 2023 the club created out first women's team and all teams will be looking to progress this year.

Our club is run by a loyal band of volunteers. It really could not exist without the support and commitment of individuals such as Don, Malcolm, Norma, Steve Samuels, the wider committee and those unsung heroes who turn up to undertake those small tasks that can make the biggest difference.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 4 - 4 PONTARDAWE TOWN (16-Sep)

Last season the two games between these teams produced 13 goals so perhaps it was no surprise that this game at Celtic Park was a 4-4 draw, Celtic's 7th draw in their last 12 home games. Celtic took the lead on 16 minutes from a speculative shot by Tom Meechan which flew over 16 year old keeper Nathaniel Osborne's head. The score remained unchanged until a frantic end to the 1st half in time added on. Alex Bonthron increased Celtic's lead with a left foot shot low into the net (45+2). 18 year old Tim Davies pulled a goal back (45+4). Sam Powell (45+6) restored Celtic's lead with a shot through the crowded box but Tim Davies (45+8) again reduced the arrears.

On 81 minutes, Lewis Iles was brought down and Bonthron scored his 2nd goal from the resultant penalty. However the visitors were not lying down. On 84 minutes Davies scored his hat-trick goal and on 90 minutes an own goal by Dominic Connor made the final score 4-4 which was Celtic's 6th home draw in their last 12 games at Celtic Park. This was Dominic Connor's 250 game for the club. He is 3rd in the all-time list behind Rakesh Patel (406) and Craig Cheedy (297). Andrew Larcombe (243) is in 4th place.

BON VOYAGE ANDREW HEWITT

Centre back Andrew Hewitt, a doctor by profession, played his last match for Celtic at Baglan Dragons last month. He is emigrating to New Zealand to embark on the next step of an exciting lucrative career. Andrew joined Celtic at the start of the 2021/22 season and made 38 appearances for the club in central defence. He scored 7 goals, three of which were vital last gasp efforts at Celtic Park against Carmarthen in the Welsh Cup to the 4th round. This he scored the in normal time MG Cup. However, was in the closing game at Celtic Park 2021/22. When he Tom Meechan's down. Three points for Risca and none for Celtic would almost certainly have relegated our boys. However Andrew strained every ounce of his neck muscles at the far post to squeeze the ball into the net. This goal gave Celtic one point and took two away from Risca. The 3 points kept Celtic up.

The game started slowly with neither side dominating but it was Celtic who had the first opportunity when Lewis Iles found himself in space just inside the box, but his shot went high and wide. However, a few minutes later Alex Bonthron battled for and won the ball in the area and then crossed to the far post. Lewis Gibbs in the home goal could only parry the ball behind him to Alex McDowell who gratefully knocked it into the net. Just after Tom Meachen played Lewis Iles in for a chance but he delayed his shot and the home defenders were able to clear the danger. Celtic put together another good move down the right early in the second period which ended with Tom Meachen playing a pass for Tyler Broom (who started the move) to run onto, but Gibbs just got to the ball first to snuff out the danger. Trefelin then put together a move down the left and Callum Saunders broke into the box only to be brought down by Tyler Broom. The referee indicated that Tyler had played the ball and waved away Trefelin's appeals for a penalty. It looked like Celtic got away with that one!! The home side then had another chance following a corner when a shot from one of their forwards went just past the post with Iwan Hooper looking well beaten. Celtic then created another chance when Alex Bonthron held the ball up brilliantly on the right of the penalty area and played a great pass into the path of Lewis McCauley, but he hit his shot high over the bar.

The game looked to be petering out to give Celtic a comfortable win when Hooper played a ball out straight to a Trefelin player on the half-way line. He spotted Hooper off his line a hit a brilliant, flighted shot that went over the 'keeper and in off a post to give the home side a possible lifeline. However, Celtic were able to play out the remainder of the game with no real problem and take the three points.
