#### **WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK**

Today we welcome Gwent rivals Abertillery Bluebirds to Celtic Park. The teams have never met in the Welsh/Cymru Leagues before this season. The Bluebirds were promoted to the Cymru South for this season having won the Ardal South-East league championship in 2022-23.

The Bluebirds have had a very difficult baptism in tier 2 this season. They are currently bottom having only won once in the league in this campaign, a 1-0 win at home against Llantwit Major on 23 September since when their record in the league is played 10 drawn 4 lost 6 which included a 4-1 home defeat against Celtic

on 7 October, Celtic's scorers were Tom Meechan 2, Alex Bonthron and Dominic Connor. Rhys Thomas scored the Bluebirds goal.

Celtic will not underestimate their opponents this afternoon who have drawn 3 of their last 4 games under new manager Josh Anderson. their latest draw being against 2<sup>nd</sup> placed Llanelli Town against whom they lost the away game 9-0 in October. The Bluebirds are captained by exCeltic favourite Richard Crees who made 236 appearances for Celtic between 2010 and 2020.





On a sunny early January day, the visitors for this rare occasion were Ammanford AFC, for a game that promised goals if both sides' recent form was anything to go by. Cwmbran were looking for revenge from the last game between the sides ending 4-3 to Ammanford.

Cwmbran made just the one change from last week's 3-2 victory over Cambrian & Clydach Vale, as new signing Callum Hodges made his debut at the back, replacing Andrew Larcombe.

Ammanford also made just the once change from their previous fixture a 2-1 Boxing Day win against Llanelli Town.

Following that goal Ammanford had a chance just six minutes later to double their advantage as they broke through the Celtic defence with a good counterattack. The ball found its way across goal to Tristan Jenkins who had an open goal to aim at, but he took his shot quickly and sliced it wide of the net.

5 minutes later and Ammanford were forced to regret that miss as a Shaun Moss long shot got parried by Martin and fell to Thomas Meechan who tapped in from very close range to level the scores at 1-1 after 36 minutes.

That was how the first half ended with not too many chances for either side but with the score level at 1-1.

The second half began with a noticeable change in style from the home side. They began to keep the ball on the ground more and due to this, Celtic were the better side for most of the second half. Cwmbran created the better chances as the half progressed, this paid off in the 54th minute as Celtic took the lead when Harrison Lewis had a thunderbolt across goal from the right side which went across goal into the left side of the net to give Celtic a deserved 2-1 lead.

For the rest of the game Cwmbran were the more dangerous of the two sides as Ammanford looked out on their feet and struggled to create many chances. The pick of these came when top scorer for the season Bonthron got on the end of a cross, however his header was saved easily by Martin in the Ammanford goal.

Ammanford's best chance of the second half came from substitute Matthew Fisher who had a curled effort from the edge of the area, but it got saved well by Lewis Watkins.

Surprisingly as the game entered the last 10 minutes, Celtic were the ones doing all the attacking. Cwmbran had a chance in the 82nd minute to score in a mirror image of the way they went behind earlier in the game. Luke Martin the away keeper came out for the ball but failed to collect it, fortunately for him though the ball was slid across goal but nobody was able to tap the ball home.

That's how the game ended with Cwmbran picking up a 2-1 victory which lifted them up to 7th in the table with 24 points after 16 games played. Supporters MOM was Isaac Powell.
