#### **WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK**

Celtic and Ammanford have met 20 times in league and cups, the first 6 during the Mickey Copeman era in Welsh League Division 2. In 2007/8 we won 1-0 at home, Shane Williamson scoring but we went down away 0-2. In 2008/9 goals by Williamson and Sayed secured a 2-0 win at Celtic Park but we were well beaten 1-4 away, Williamson again scoring. In our promotion season, 2009/10, we lost away 1-2 in a game in which Celtic's goalscorer Scott Lanyon was red carded after the final whistle for allegedly head butting the referee. He was subsequently banned for 18 months, reduced on appeal to 4 months, and when Celtic filed arbitration papers, the FAW, the club and the player agreed a settlement. Celtic won the return at Celtic Park 4-0, the scorers Luke Sallis, Kesh Patel, Sean Matthews and Lloyd Davies.

In 2013/14 both teams finished 4<sup>th</sup> from bottom in their respective divisions, Celtic in the 1<sup>st</sup> division, Ammanford in Division 2, which under the existing rules should have meant they retained their status but both were relegated to allow Afan Lido to drop down from the Welsh Premier League. Celtic appealed and eventually lost in farcical jurisdictional circumstances in arbitration. Justice was done as in the following season, 2014/15, Ammanford came straight back up to Division 2, and in 2015/16 Celtic were promoted back to Division 1.

In Celtic's promotion season 2015/16 we won at home 3-0 through goals by Bull, Dominic Connor and Ham. The away game was played in atrocious conditions on a rain-soaked pitch in a barn-storming game. Celtic won 4-3, the goals from Bull 2, Andrew Larcombe and Connor in Celtic's 10<sup>th</sup> successive Welsh League away win. In 2016/17 Celtic won 3-0 at Ammanford in the 1st round of the League Cup, the scorers Rhys Williams, Bull and Lee Penry. After steadying the ship in 2016/17 the West Walians young manager Gruf Harrison guided his team to promotion to the top tier the following season after an absence of 16 years.

In 2018/19 5-3 Celtic won 5-3 at home, Celtic's goal scorers Josh Bull, Chris Ham, Owen Cook, Louis Feeley and an own goal. The teams met again at Celtic Park in the Welsh Cup round 1, Celtic coming out on top 3-0 through goals by Ham, Bull and Isaac Powell, who, at age 17 became Celtic's first scorer born in the Millennium. Ammanford took revenge in the away fixture, smashing Celtic 5-0.

In the covid curtailed season 2019-20 the teams met once, at Ammanford, and again the hosts went on the rampage winning 5-2. Celtic's scorers Zac Osborne and Leo Ross. In 2021-22, at Ammanford, the home side were 2-1 ahead mid-way through the 2<sup>nd</sup> half but Celtic made a superb comeback, clinching a 3-2 win with goals from Tyler Broom, Tom Meechan and Jordan Meaney. Celtic won the tightly fought return 1-0 at Celtic Park to complete a league double, Alex Bonthron scoring on his first Celtic start. Last season Celtic beat Ammanford 1-0 in the 1<sup>st</sup> round of the Welsh Cup at Celtic Park thanks to a Dominic Connor goal. This was Celtic's 8<sup>th</sup> successive win at home against the Swansea valley side. In the league Ammanford were the victors at home, winning 3-2, Lewis Iles scoring Celtic's 2 goals. In the return at Celtic Park Ammanford at last managed to avoid defeat with a 1-1 draw, Josh Rippon scoring for Celtic. This season Ammanford won an exciting match 4-3 at their ground, Alex Bonthron (2) & Lewis Iles scoring for Celtic.

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2023

#### A BRIEF HISTORY OF AMMANFORD

Ammanford AFC was formed in the early 20<sup>th</sup> century, plying its trade in the Ammanford and District League at Rice Road. The first recorded fixture to date was in 1908/09, when Ammanford Town played a friendly against a Rhondda touring team. In the 1920's, Ammanford Thursdays played at Caemawr, Betws, before the first Betws soccer club called Betws Blackbirds played on Rice Road with their dressing rooms and headquarters at The Coopers Hotel, Betws during the 1930's. The committee at that time had the foresight to purchase the playing field and for land to build a club house for £750. It wasn't until 1949 when Ammanford entered the Welsh Football League, then under the name of Betws. In 1957/58, we finished runners up to Llanelli, before being crowned champions of Division 2 (West) and promoted to Division 1 in 1958/59. We also won the Division 2 cup, beating Division 2 (East) champions Tredomen. On Saturday 22<sup>nd</sup> August 1959 the club played its opening First Division Welsh League fixture at home against Cardiff City Reserves and won 2 -1. At the request of the Welsh Football League, we changed our name to Ammanford Town in 1960. It didn't take long to stamp our authority on the Welsh League circuit, employing former Liverpool player Roy Saunders to take over the helm in the early 1960's. This was followed with the clubhouse being built at Rice Road in 1963. In 1964, at a cost of £4,000, a 450 seater stand and new changing rooms were built at Rice Road. From 1966/67 to 67/68 we finished Runners-up to Cardiff City Reserves in consecutive seasons. Our main cup achievement came in 1983/84, where we reached the Final of Welsh Football League Cup, losing to Lake United in the final. In 1992, we amalgamated with Ammanford Athletic to become Ammanford AFC. Unfortunately, in April 2003, a fire destroyed the stand and changing rooms at Rice Road, the start of the demise of the Rice Road ground. Therefore, in 2006 we moved to our new ground 'The Rec'. Dimensions of the new pitch were 101 x 63 metres. Despite being relegated in 2013/14 due to a Welsh Pyramid restructure, we went on a 15 match win streak to gain promotion back to Welsh League Division Two in 2014/15. We remained in this division for three years before gaining promotion to Welsh League Division One for the 2018/19 season.

The club reached the fourth round of the Welsh Cup in 1991 and made it to the quarter-finals in February 1999.

Broke his leg playing for Llanelli against Caerau in 2014, but has become a well-respected performer at this level after reforming his game from a flying winger.

**Callum Silcox:** Age 26. Forward. Attacker who joined from Pontardawe Town this summer after winning the Ardal Southern. Pontardawe top goalscorer last season with 13 goals in just 17 Ardal Southern games. Started his career with Barnet before joining Llanelli Town. Has also played for Garden Village. A top match winner on his day.



Celtic equalised on 28 minutes when Alex Bonthron trapped a superb long ball from Tom Meechan and cut inside to coolly slot the ball home. Cam were back in front on 42 minutes, Keetch scoring from Liam Reed's assist. However Celtic were level on the stroke of half-time when Lewis Iles took advantage of a Cam mistake in defence to steer the ball into the net. Cam went 3-2 up in the 73<sup>rd</sup> minute when Lewis Watkins was adjudged to have fouled the attacker on the edge of the box when it was clearly a 50-50 challenge. Woodford scored the penalty goal. Deep into time added on Celtic were awarded what looked like a soft penalty for a foul on Dominic Connor. Alex Bonthron scored from the spot. However, Cam were not finished and on 90+8 Vincent pooped up for his 2<sup>nd</sup> headed goal to clinch the points for his team.

This was Celtic's 4<sup>th</sup> successive defeat and keeps them in 11<sup>th</sup> place. However there are just 4 points separating them from 6<sup>th</sup> place. #### MATCH REPORT: CAMBRIAN & CLYDACH 2 - 3 CWMBRAN CELTIC (29-Dec)

Celtic travelled to the M & G 3g in Clydach Vale to try to avenge the 4-3 defeat inflicted on them by Cambrian & Clydach the previous Saturday.

Celtic started the game very slowly and seemed to be struggling to come to terms with the 3g surface. A lot of passes were going astray and the hosts were dominating the game to the extent that we hardly got out of our own half for the first 15/20 minutes. It was a bonus when on the stroke of half time, Tom Meechan chested down a long kick from 'keeper Lewis Watkins, turned and hit a stunning 30 yard volley that flew past Morgan Davies to give Celtic the lead going into the break. It was certainly a contender for Goal of the Season!!

#### Half-time: Cambrian & Clydach 1 Celtic 2

The second half started in much the same vein with Celtic struggling to get a real foothold in the game and, again, it was little surprise when Liam Reed scored his second goal after a bit of a scramble in the six yard box following a cleverly placed free kick from Jay Woodford.

This goal did, however, seem to spark Celtic into life and they started to play the football they are capable of and put some good moves together, particularly down the left hand side. It now looked that, if either side was going to get a winner, it was Celtic and it duly arrived in the 87<sup>th</sup> minute. Tom Meechan played a pinpoint cross from the right and Alex Bonthron was on hand to head it low to Davies' right and, although he managed to get a hand to the ball, he could only help it into the net. This was Alex's 15<sup>th</sup> goal of the season and it put him joint top of the Cymru (South) Scorers list with Luke Bowen of Briton Ferry Llansawel. Tom's assist also extended his lead at the top of the League's Assists table!

This was not one of Celtic's best performances but it was a very welcome 3 points and, as they say, it's a good sign if you can win when not playing particularly well.



#### **CWMBRAN CELTIC REVIEW FOR 2023**

2023 has been one of the best years from Cwmbran Celtic during their 11 seasons in FAW tier 2. They finished season 2022/3 in 8<sup>th</sup> place and have maintained that position at the half-way stage of the current season.

This season in the league, the games have been incredibly tight, apart from the 3 draws only one goal separating the teams in the other 12 games.

There has been a big contrast in our home and away league form during 2023:

We have had no problem finding the net, scoring in 31 out of 35 league & cup games, but we have only had 2 clean sheets out of 35 - none at all in 18 games this season. In this regard we have not been helped by the loss of central defenders Andrew Hewitt (with his job in New Zealand) and Jordan Meaney (retired). New recruits to the squad in 2023 were central defender Harrison Lewis and goalkeeper Iwan Hooper. We lost Josh Rippon at the end of last season to the USA but he returned to the fold in October. Josh Hinwood has returned from a brief stint at Croesyceiliog and has secured a regular place in the squad. Also back with us is Alex Bonthron after his spell at Southern League Merthyr Town.

We have achieved some memorable away wins. 2-1 at Briton Ferry, their only home league defeat of the season. 5-1 at Taffs Well where Lewis Iles scored 4 goals, and two successive wins at Cambrian & Clydach, always a tough place to get a result.

Earlier in the year we reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup for the 2<sup>nd</sup> time in our history before going out to the eventual winners. In January we knocked out perennial giant killers Penydarren BGC away from home. This season was not so good – we were knocked out of all 3 cup competitions at the first attempt.
