WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

We welcome Cambrian United to Celtic Park this afternoon. They have changed their name this season having been formerly Cambrian & Clydach Vale BC. Both clubs were promoted to Welsh League Division 3 in 2005/6 and Cambrian won all 3 games between the clubs: 2-1 in the league cup at Cwmbran Stadium, Jason Price scored for Celtic; 1-0 at home; 2-0 at the Stadium as they went on to win the 3rd Division title, beating Treowen Stars in the final game of the season, a win which secured Celtic's place in the Welsh League ahead of Treowen who were demoted to the Gwent County League.

The following season Cambrian were promoted to the 1st Division and Celtic joined them in 2010/11. That season Cambrian won at Celtic Park 2-1, Richard Crees scoring for Celtic. In the return at Lakeside, Celtic achieved a superb 2-0 win with goals from Luke Sallis and Kesh Patel. In 2011/12 Celtic lost 1-3 at Lakeside, Scott Lanyon scored as Celtic completed a horrendous run of just one win in 9 games. Cambrian won the return at Celtic Park 3-0 to clinch the 1st Division championship title.

In 2012/13 Celtic lost 1-0 away in the league and 1-0 at home in the Welsh Cup – their 7th successive defeat in league and cup that season and, against Cambrian, their 5th successive home loss and 8th loss out of 9. However, they achieved a great 4-2 win against the reigning champions in the return. Celtic went 4-0 up through Josh Bull, Owen Cook, Kesh Patel and Lee Challenger (penalty) before the champions pulled two late goals back. In 2013/14 Cambrian won easily at Lakeside 4-1, Rhys Hodges scoring for Celtic, but Celtic put in a superb performance in the return to win 4-3. Cambrian were 2-1 up at half time, Lloyd Kinsella scoring for Celtic. In the 2nd half Owen Cook was sent off but man of the match Dominic Connor equalised. Then Richard Crees was sent off – the second successive match in which Celtic were down to 9 men. Amazingly Celtic went 3-2 up through Owen Llewellyn. Cambrian got an equaliser with 6 minutes left but Josh Bull snatched the winner to bring about a fabulous victory for Celtic. Celtic ended up relegated to Division 2 despite finishing 4th from bottom.

In 2016/17 Celtic won 3-1 at Cambrian with goals by Bull, Lee Penry and Kinsella. Cambrian won the return 3-1. Celtic's goal scorer was Niall Yeates. Celtic finished the season in 6th place. Cambrian finished 11th which was the first time in the two club's 12 years together in the Welsh League that Celtic had finished ahead of the Rhondda side. In 2017/18 Cambrian won 3-1 at Celtic Park, Chris Ham scoring, and won 1-0 at Lakeside. In 2018/19 Celtic lost 0-2 at Lakeside and lost 1-3 at home, Ham scoring for Celtic. In 2019/20 the teams met only once, at Cambrian which the hosts won easily 3-0. Season 2020/21 was abandoned because of Covid.

In 2021/22 Celtic won 3-1 win at home, the goals from Tom Meechan (2) and Jordan Meaney. It was business as usual in the return Cambrian winning at a canter 4-1, Andrew Hewitt scoring for Celtic. In 2022/23 the teams played out an exciting 3-3 draw at Celtic Park, Alex Bonthron 2 and Lewis Iles scoring for Celtic. Celtic triumphed in the return 2-0 with goals from Lewis Iles and Tom Meachen. Last season the teams met twice over the Christmas break. Cambrian won 4-3 at Celtic Park, Bonthron 2 (1 penalty) & Lewis Iles scored for Celtic. In the return Celtic won at Lakeside 3-2 through goals by Bonthron, Shaun Moss & Tom Meechan.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. Last season Celtic finished a creditable 8th in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 2 - 3 TRETHOMAS BLUEBIRDS (20-Jul)

Nathaniel MG Cup Round 1

The Welsh football season kicked off in a unique atmosphere as Cwmbran's first game of the season began with a 12:30 kick off due to the Cwmbran Crow Fest next door with intermittent music being played during the match and the weather seemingly changing its mind every five minutes.

The game kicked off as Cwmbran started slowly in this Nathaniel Mg Cup tie against newly promoted and big spending Trethomas Bluebirds. The only highlight of the opening ten minutes for the hosts was a Thomas Meechan mid-range shot being saved easily.

It was a very different matter for the visitors as they had a couple chances in the early minutes and took the lead after ten minutes when the ball bounced in a crowd of players on the edge of the area and fell nicely for Levi Rees to pounce his shot whizzed past Watkins in the home net before he had a chance to react.

The next 15 mins saw Trethomas gain control of the game as they kept more of the ball without really threatening the goal save for a hairy moment for Watkins when a cross from the left side looped over him as he attempted to catch the ball. Luckily Cwmbran's defence managed to hoof the ball away before there was any more danger.

That slice of good fortune proved important as no sooner had I written in my notes that Celtic were struggling to link more than two passes together then they had the ball in the back of the Trethomas net after twenty-five minutes thanks to none other than Alex Bonthron who slid the ball home after finding himself in lots of space in the right side of the area after a Bluebirds player went down in the opposite side during the buildup.

This equaliser appeared to wake up the home side whose performance improved immediately as the home side quickly had a couple efforts to take the lead including Bonthron hitting a half volley outside the visitor's area which went wide of the net.

After thirty-seven minutes came the funniest moment of the game at least for this reporter as Trethomas had a free kick halfway inside the home half and the festival next door played a loud thudding noise as if it was a loud heartbeat to increase the anxiety. Thankfully the free kick went harmlessly very very high over the net.

Three minutes later though it was the Bluebirds who had their anxiety levels increased as Andrew Larcombe got a glancing header on the end of a cross from the left side and the ball flew past Cameron Clarke in the visitors net to give Celtic a two-one lead at half time.

Following the half time break Simon Berry was forced into his first change as Cwmbran manager when he brought on Joshua Rippon for Callum Hodges who got a knock late on in the first half.

The second half began quickly with the promised rain still holding off for the most part with the hosts starting with a very nice period of possession which led to a harmless corner.

Only five minutes into the restart and the Bluebirds levelled the game once again as Leon Thomas in almost a mirror image of Bonthron earlier goal found himself in oceans of space in the left side of the Cwmbran area and slotted the ball home nicely past Lewis Watkins.

Alex Bonthron was clearly enjoying the game as in the fifty second minute when trying to get on the end of a cross he attempted to unleash his inner Bellingham but unfortunately his overhead kick went well wide.

Seven minutes later a free kick taken by Alfie Jones for Trethomas from the left side of the box was whipped very nicely onto the head of William Bevan who powered the ball home with a very good header for the visitors to regain the lead at 3-2 after fifty-nine minutes.

Unfortunately, the last half hour of the game passed pretty much without incident as the rain started to get heavier and make playing conditions more difficult. The only remaining incidents of note were when Bluebirds had five corners in a row before the Celtic defence finally managed to clear the ball away. Also Leon Thomas capped a good performance as he had a good run down the left hand side jinking past a couple defenders before being brought down just outside the box for a free kick which was curled past the wall but was saved well by Watkins.

That was how the game finished with Cwmbran Celtic failing to progress past the first round of a cup competition for the fourth year in a row.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CAMBRIAN UNITED

Cambrian & Clydach Vale was originally formed in 1965 as Cambrian United and was named after the local coal mine, Cambrian Colliery. In its formative years, the club played in the Rhondda & District League before joining the South Wales Corinthian League in 1972. In 1980, Cambrian United merged with Clydach Vale Boys and Girls Club but the merger proved disappointing as the club were nearly relegated out of the renamed South Wales Amateur League. The two clubs subsequently split.

In 1992, Cambrian United returned to the First Division of the South Wales Amateur League after winning the Second Division title. By the end of the decade, the club was regularly competitive at the top of the First Division, missing out on winning the league title during the 2000–01 season after being deducted six points. Cambrian United and Clydach Vale Boys and Girls Club merged for a second time in 2002 to become Cambrian & Clydach Vale Boys and Girls Club and the venture proved more successful. In its third year, the club won the First Division of the South Wales Amateur League and were promoted to the Welsh Football League.

In its first two seasons in the Welsh Football League, the club won consecutive promotions to reach the First Division by the 2007–08 season. The side has remained in the division for over a decade since. Former England manager Terry Venables, whose mother was from the Clydach Vale area, served as an honorary chairman of the club in the 2010s.

The club reached the final of the 2018–19 Welsh League Cup, beating several Welsh Premier League teams during the competition, including defending league and cup champions The New Saints. In the final, Cambrian lost 2–0 to Cardiff Metropolitan University at Jenner Park.

Ahead of the 2024–25 season, the club renamed back to Cambrian United.

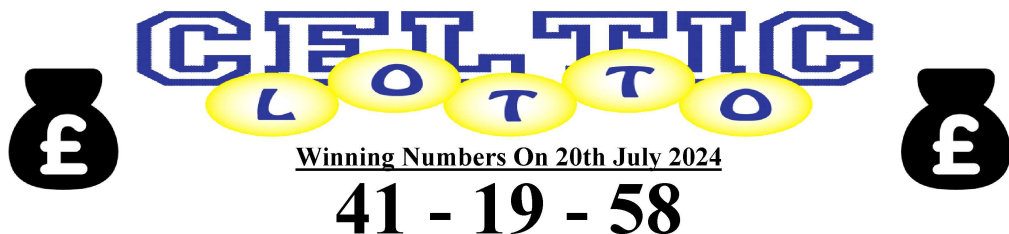

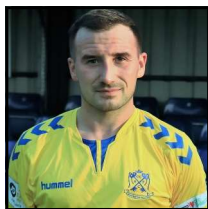

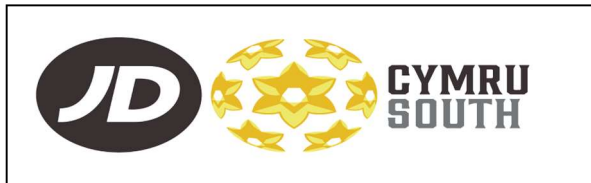
