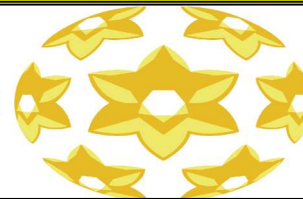

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

This afternoon we welcome to Llantwit Major to Celtic Park for the most crucial last game of the season. Celtic and Penrhiwceiber Rangers are both on 27 points. If Celtic win, or if both sides draw or lose, then, barring Rangers winning or Celtic losing by 4 goals more, Celtic will stay up in the Cymru South league. Ironically, Celtic were in a similar position in their final home game against Llantwit Major in 2022/23. See 3rd para below.

Celtic and Llantwit Major first met in the last season of the Welsh League division 1 in September 2018 on a windy and rainy afternoon at the Windmill Ground. Celtic snatched victory 1-0 through a Chris Ham goal. A superb performance from goalkeeper Rhys Picton on his Celtic debut denied the hosts a point. Llantwit gained revenge in the return in January 2019 at Celtic Park, winning 4-2 against a Celtic team ravaged by injury. Celtic started without their two regular centre backs, Rhys Williams (suspended) and Niall Yeates (stopped playing) and then at half time they lost their replacement pairing of Rakesh Patel and Luke Jones. Debutant right back Kallum Hajgato also had to go off. Chris Ham scored both Celtic goals.

In 2019/20 Llantwit won 2-0 at Celtic Park but Celtic won the spoils in the away game 2-1 through Louis Feeley and a Chris Ham penalty. In the opening league fixture of 2021-22 Llantwit won 2-0 at the Windmill Ground. In the closing last day fixture at Celtic Park the newly crowned champions stretched their unbeaten run to 13 games with a 5-0 win. Celtic needed the results of two fellow strugglers to go their way. Ammanford won and Risca were 1-0 ahead into the 2nd half at Afan Lido at which point Celtic were going down. However Lido scored twice late on which allowed Celtic to finish 13th and to escape relegation. There were dual celebrations at the Celtic club after the match.

In 2022/23 two goals by Alex Bonthron (one a penalty) gave Celtic their 1st win of the season at the Windmill Ground 2-0. In October Celtic looked like being dumped out of the Welsh Cup when Major were 2 up midway through the 2nd half, however Lewis Iles pulled a goal back and in time added on Bonthron equalised from the penalty spot. Celtic duly won the penalty shoot-out 3-0 thanks to 2 great saves by keeper Joe Regan. In the return league game at Celtic Park Llantwit avenged their two defeats with a 2-1 win. Lewis Iles scored Celtic's goal.

Last season Bonthron again scored 2 goals in Celtic's 2-1 win at Celtic Park which ended Celtic's run of 8 successive home games without a win. In the away game Lewis Iles scored in his 100th game for Celtic as the teams drew 1-1. This season Llantwit won 2-1 at the Windmill Ground. Oscar Balkwill scored for Celtic.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024

Cwmbran Celtic football club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/6 there was then a 25 year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/1. The club disbanded in the late 1950's largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but a large influx of junior and youth players brought about the reforming of the club in 1964 under the new name of Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/1 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/3 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League.

In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/7 remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/5 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were able to share Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/6, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April Celtic travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/7, Celtic now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost 2 games and enjoyed a 24 match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With 3 minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box.

He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/8 and 2008/9 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2024 *(continued)*

In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after 7 years during which he secured 3 promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won 7 and drew 3 of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10

straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first 5 games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in 5 seasons in the top tier.

In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals.

In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With 9 new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo.

Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21 only one game was played, in December 2020/21, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup.

In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom 3 and in the final analysis an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In the past two seasons Celtic have finished creditable 8th and 9th place in the table.

This season we have a new manager Simon Berry who replaced James after he decided to step down from the Men's 1st team and concentrate solely on the Women's 1st team.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF LLANTWIT MAJOR

Llantwit Major Football Club was formed in 1962. A selection committee selected the team until entry to the South Wales Amateur League Second Division was gained in 1971. Life Member Gwyn John was appointed as the first team manager. Manager John's team were promoted to the 1st Division after finishing second in the 1976–77 season. Llantwit consolidated in the division before claiming their first Amateur League title under new manager Alan Foster in the 1979–80 season. This was closely followed by their second championship just a year later after retaining the title and adding the Corinthian Cup to achieve the double. This kick started a golden period in the 80's where the club won another double of league and Corinthian Cup in 1983–84. The hat-trick of Corinthian Cups came in the 1986–87 season. The club were also runners up in the league on a further two occasions during the decade.

The 1990s by contrast was a very mixed period for the club, first relegation in 1991–92 under Rob Sherman's leadership, followed by promotion two years later with Steve Manning at the helm. Fast forward two years and relegation, this time with record appearance holder Pete Lingham as player/manager. However, the club made sure they were in the first division again at the turn of the millennium, the management duo of Kev Pycroft and Phil Clay gaining promotion by winning a comfortable Second Division title. The club spent the next decade consistently flirting with the league title without ever looking like serious title contenders with Llantwit stalwarts Tim Watts and John Guy providing much needed stability in charge. The club also came runners up in the Corinthian Cup in 2005. John Guy stepped down as manager in 2010 following a decade as manager to move upstairs as chairman. Guy did this selflessly in order to allow the introduction of fresh ideas into the club from new boss Kevin Rees in partnership with Watts. Rees and Watts introduced fresh blood into the playing staff gaining instant success by lifting the SWFA Senior Cup in 2010–11. The bedrock of the new players was Darren Robinson who became player/coach/manager along with the irrepressible Watts.

Supporters and rivalries

Llantwit Major supporters are known as the 'Windmill Army', and can draw crowds of up to 250 for important matches such as their 2018 title decider against STM Sports. For many years, the number one rival was St. Athan, however this rivalry has diminished due to Llantwit's rise through the leagues. Instead, Pen-Y-Bont FC have become the opposition most looked forward to by fans and players alike. A rivalry has also developed with Ammanford AFC, which began when a Twitter video posted by the Llantwit Major Twitter account after a 3–1 victory left numerous players and supporters of the Ammanford side in tears.

Meanwhile, the club has friendly links with Dutch club Feyenoord Rotterdam, Boca Juniors and Port Talbot Town.

Recent success (2016-onwards)

Llantwit Major have enjoyed incredible success in recent years, rising from the amateur divisions to the second tier of Welsh football. Manager Karl Lewis has established a strong squad of players from the local area, many of whom have been playing together for their entire lives. The most notable success so far was lifting the Welsh Football League Division Two title in the 2017/18 season, in the club's first season at that level having been promoted from Division Three the season before. Former players Sam Snaith and Adam Roscrow have gone on to play in the Welsh Premier League with Cardiff Met, and the club also enjoyed a victory over Barry Town AFC – one of the biggest clubs in Wales. The Windmill Lane stadium has also seen improvements, with the addition of a new seating area and concrete standing areas, as well as improvements to the bar and clubhouse. Following a 4 - 3 victory over Pontypridd Town, Karl Lewis announced he would leave the club at the end of the season. Darren Robinson was announced as his replacement shortly after.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF LLANTWIT MAJOR *(Continued)*

Cymru South 2019–20

For the 2019–20 season, Llantwit were inaugural members of the Cymru South. A number of improvements were made to the ground and pitch to be ready for the campaign, with the highlight being the addition of a new main stand.

Llantwit finished the season in 11th place, with the final standings determined on a points per game basis due to the coronavirus crisis. This meant Llantwit finished clear of relegation and would once again be in the second tier the following season. The highlight of the season was the return of former Manager Karl Lewis, who had overseen the most successful period in the history of the club.

Cymru South 2021–22

With the 2020–21 campaign cancelled due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic, Llantwit once again remained in the Cymru South. Far from the relegation battle they were predicted to endure, Llantwit led the table for much of the 2021–22 season, and were crowned champions on 18 April 2022, following a 3–1 victory away at Undy Athletic. It was an outstanding campaign for the Major, beating almost every team in the league at least once, with Swansea University FC the only exception.

Cymru South 2022–23

Before the 22/23 season, manager Karl Lewis decided to leave the club to become an assistant at Briton Ferry FC. He took seven current Llantwit players with him, leaving the club with a significant rebuild. New manager Stevie Campbell-McCarthy was quickly appointed, who went to work bringing in new players.

Former manager Lewis would continue to raid the club, taking a total of 15 former Llantwit players with him during the course of the season. Despite this, new signings such as Matt Kimmins and Paolo Marengi enabled Llantwit to be in a decent position at the halfway point of the season, overcoming a poor start to the campaign to sit mid table. Despite a poor end to the season with no wins from the final 4, Llantwit strongly beat their expectations to finish in 7th place.

Cymru South 2023–24

Stevie McCarthy-Campbell was dismissed early in the season, replaced by incoming manager Ben Stait. The Major were in the bottom three when Stait took over, but he bought around a huge improvement on the previous manager, and was able to secure safety on the final day of the season with a 3–0 victory away to Carmarthen Town. Llantwit had the best defence in the league over the second half of the season, and will be optimistic about the new campaign as the Ben Stait era can truly begin.

Fenix Trophy

In 2023, Llantwit became the first Welsh side to play in the group stages of a UEFA competition, by being invited to the FENIX Trophy. They were drawn against sides from England and Denmark in the group stages. Llantwit performed well throughout the competition, finishing in 2nd place in Group A, including a historic 1–0 victory over reigning champions BK Skjold. This made Llantwit the first team in Welsh football history to win a UEFA group stage match.

Llantwit were invited back to the competition the following year, facing off against Belgian side Berchem Sport in the first round

Anti-racism work

On 25th March 2023, the club turned out in opposition to a demonstration held by neo-Nazi group Patriotic Alternative. Later that afternoon, they played a match under the banner of Show Racism the Red Card against Afan Lido F.C., winning 2-0. Italian anti-fascist folk song Bella Ciao was played over the speaker.

MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 0 - 2 BAGLAN DRAGONS (29-Mar)

Cwmbrian Celtic's defeat at Celtic Park to Baglan Dragons has placed them in a perilous position in the Cymru South relegation battle with 2 games to go. Celtic had more territorial possession than the visitors but they succumbed to two goals which, with tighter defending they could have prevented. The first goal in the 29th minute came from a hopeful punt forward down the left wing by Dylan Thomas to Thomas Davies who had room to turn in and fashion a shot which beat keeper Lewis Watkins at the near post. Baglan's 2nd goal on 78 minutes was scored by Dylan Thomas who reacted quickest on the edge of the penalty area to pounce on a Celtic half clearance to drive the ball low into the net. Celtic's best chance fell to Isaac Powell in the 2nd half when he worked his way down the left into a shooting position, but keeper Matthew Stanton stood firm to comfortably save the shot.

With 14th placed Penrhiwceiber Rangers sneaking a 90th minute win at Caerau (Ely), Celtic are now just one point ahead of the valleys side with a superior 5 goal difference. Rangers' next opponents (at home) are Ammanford who have lost 5 of their last 8 games. Celtic's opponents, Newport City away, have won their last 5 games so Celtic have a mighty task next weekend to keep themselves above Rangers after which there is just one game left.

MATCH REPORT: NEWPORT CITY 2 - 0 CWMBRAN CELTIC (04-Apr)

Cwmbrian Celtic lost this crucial Friday night game under the Newport Stadium floodlights which leaves them just one game in which to maintain their Cymru South status. City took the lead on 13 minutes when from a Celtic tackle the ball fell kindly to Danny Hillman whose shot from the edge of the penalty box skimmed its way into the corner of the net. City's 2nd goal in the 82nd minute came from a cross from the right by Sing which Mackenzie Thompson headed home at the far post.

Despite the scoreline Celtic held their own throughout the game. They had chances – in the 1st half, a Larcombe half chance shot went wide and a van Dieren header was also wide from a corner. In the 2nd half a smart bout of interplay started by Joe Bowen ended with the midfielder's shot from close range being smothered by keeper Riella. For Newport Sing grazed the bar late on.

In the other critical games on Friday Afan Lido won and are safe. Goytre United lost and they are now down. This afternoon Penrhiwceiber Rangers drew with Ammanford. Celtic and Rangers go into their final games next Saturday neck and neck. Celtic have a 3-goal better goal difference and they have scored more goals than Rangers so if the teams match each other with their results next Saturday and so finish level on points, and provided Rangers don't pull the goal difference back by 4 goals, Celtic will stay up.






















Celtic have the advantage of a home game - against Llantwit Major. Rangers play at Carmarthen Town who are unbeaten in their last 7 home games. However, Rangers are the form team having taken 9 points from their last 6 games compared with Celtic's 4. The odds really couldn't be tighter.

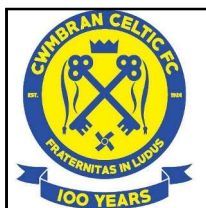

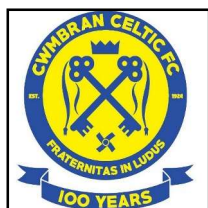

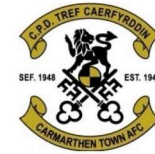
