WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Today we extend a warm welcome to Caerau (Ely). The teams have played each other 24 times, 18 in the Welsh League, 4 times in the Cymru South and twice in the Welsh Cup. In 2007/8 in the Welsh League 2nd Division Celtic lost 3-4 at Cwrt-yr-Ala, their goals by Ben Evans, Craig Cheedy and Sam Winter. Player-manager Mickey Copeman got a straight red. In the return Celtic, fielding 8 teenagers, won 3-1 through goals by Evans, Jamie Parsons and Luke Sallis. In 2008/9 we won the home game 3-0, Owen Llewellyn, Scot Lanyon and Sean Matthews scoring. In the end of season return we were thrashed 2-6 after going 2-0 up through 2 goals from Lanyon. Celtic were short of players that night so sponge man Mike Baugh aged 45 made his only Welsh League appearance.

In 2009/10 Caerau did the double, winning 2-1 at Celtic Park, Dale Howarth scoring for Celtic, and winning 3-0 in the last game of the season which cost Celtic the 2nd Division championship and secured promotion for Caerau in 3rd place. In 2010/11, in the 1st Division, the teams fought out two draws, 0-0 away and 3-3 at home, Llewellyn 2 and Kesh Patel scoring, Luke Jones making his debut. In 2011/12 Celtic did the double, 2-1 away thanks to goals by Llewellyn and Shane Williamson, and 3-1 at Celtic Park, Dominic Connor 2 and Nana Baah scoring.

In 2013/14 Caerau won both matches 2-1, Connor scoring the Celtic goals in both games. Celtic were relegated at the end of that season. In 2014/15 Caerau won 2-0 at Celtic Park in the Welsh Cup. In 2016/17 newly promoted Celtic played out a classic top of the table 2-2 draw at Cwrt-Yr-Ala. Celtic took a 2 goal lead through goals by Chris Ham but 2 goals from Lloyd Toghill in the last 5 minutes rescued a point for Caerau. James Young made his Celtic debut in that game The return was a goalfest, Celtic winning 6-4 with goals from Josh Bull (3), Niall Yeates 2 and Lloyd Kinsella.

In 2017/18 Celtic won the league fixture at Cwrt-yr-Ala 5-0 with a hat-trick from Chris Ham including two penalties, and a brace from Josh Bull. Two weeks later we returned to play Caerau in the Welsh Cup and won 1-0 with a goal in the closing minutes by Josh Bull. In the league game at Celtic Park we won 2-0 through 2 goals by Lewis Iles. Caerau were relegated that season but were back in the newly formed Cymru South for season 2019/20. Celtic won 2-0 at home thanks to goals from Ham (penalty) and Niall Yeates. The return game was vital, both sides being in the bottom 3. Celtic recovered from 1-0 down to win 2-1, the goals from Lewis Sommers and a Ham penalty. The win took Celtic above Taffs Well into 13th place and safety as the season ended there because of the covid pandemic whereas Caerau were relegated. They were promoted in 2023 & in 2023-24 Celtic won 3-2 at home, scorers Alex Bonthron, Andrew Larcombe & Alex McDowell. Caerau won the return 4-2, Bonthron & Isaac Powell scoring for Celtic. Last season Celtic did the double, winning 3-2 at Celtic Park through goals by Jack Prosser 2 and Cole Doolan, and 2-1 away, the goals by Doolan and Alex McDowell.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2025

Cwmbran Celtic Football Club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/26 there was then a 25-year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/51. The club disbanded in the late 1950s largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but an influx of junior and youth players brought about the re-forming of the club in 1964 under the new name Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/71 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/73 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League. In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/87 they remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/05 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were shared Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/06, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April they travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1 -0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/07, Celtic, now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost two games and enjoyed a 24-match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With three minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box. He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/08 and 2008/09 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy. In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial

time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after seven years during which he secured three promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won seven and drew three of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champioAns Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first five games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in five seasons in the top tier. In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals. In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With nine new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo. Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21, because of the covid pandemic only one game was played, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup. In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom three and an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In 2022/23 Celtic finished 8^{th.} In 2023/24 they finished 10th Alex Botnrhon won the Cymru South Golden Boot with 30 goals. Last season, in the club's centenary season, under new manager Simon Berry, Celtic lost several key players including Alex Bonthron during the season, but Simon recruited a number of young replacements and the team beat Llantwit Major on the last day of the season to finish 13th and avoid relegation.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CAERAU (ELY)

Caerau Ely AFC is a Cardiff-based Football Club that was formed in 1955, joining the junior division of the Cardiff Combination League. Caerau Ely AFC strives to provide players with a sustainable, community-focused programme with the long-term aim of achieving Welsh Premier League Football for the Capital City of Wales.

Our ethos and core principles want to capture the unity and intertwined multicultural community that Caerau Ely AFC as a local Cardiff Club will represent.

As a club and our home, we are based in Cardiff at Cwrt-Yr-Ala for all of our home matches, with training taking place at Ocean Park Arena. As part of our long-term development and ambitions, we aim to develop a sustainable club model with an experienced and dynamic staff, a local player base, a national standard facility, and an infrastructure to give the people of Cardiff & the Vale a capital city club to be proud of.

The ethos of Caerau Ely AFC is to further develop a community club that the area can be really proud of.

A major part of our plans will be to produce a new player pathway for footballers in Cardiff & the Vale of Glamorgan with the aim of providing the Capital City with a local community club that truly represents the Capital City and the Vale of Glamorgan locally, regionally and nationally.

Caerau Ely AFC will base all training in the City's first-class indoor and outdoor sports venue at Ocean Park Arena in Central Cardiff on Ocean Way.

The foundations for the success of Caerau Ely AFC will lay with recruiting and developing local talent that we have in Cardiff and the Vale of Glamorgan. We are committed to continuing our development of first-class coaching, training, playing facilities and opportunities in the capital at some of the best facilities in the Country.



Isaac Powell was having a great game for Celtic and he rode a tackle, drove forward and then unleashed a ball into the box which caught the defender in two minds and Josh Gibson nipped in to bring a fine reaction save from keeper Susso. Isaac was at the fore again when his long ball from the left was not controlled by the defender and Gibson was on hand to bring another save from Susso. In the 65th minute Celtic gave away a sloppy goal to allow Trethomas back in front. A cross from the left was allowed to pass across goal by a Celtic defender for Haben Samson to screw back into the 6-yard box. The ball bobbled about and fell invitingly to Salmon to stab over the line from a yard out. MATCH REPORT: CARDIFF DRACONIANS 2 - 1 CWMBRAN CELTIC (04-Oct)

For the 3rd game running Celtic took the lead but again they were unable to stay in front and the Draconians recovered to win 2-1, their 2nd win against Celtic within the last 14 days.

The Draconians wasted no time in laying siege on the Celtic goal and in the 2nd minute a great cross ball put left wing Myles Corson in to shoot wide across the goal. Josh Hinwood shot over the bar from the edge of the penalty box and then Corson turned provider when he set up a shot which went just wide of the right post. In the 9th minute against the run of play Celtic took the lead when Finley Hayman played a long ball out of defence to the unmarked Josh Gibson who hit a glorious lob over the keeper Johnson who had started to advance, then backtracked and finally fell over his own feet as Josh's cool lob floated into the net. Thereafter, the home side dominated the rest of the half with Corson playing havoc on the left with his direct running and on the half hour he set up what looked like a certain 2nd goal with a ball into the box where Dan Bowen, timing his run to perfection, pounced to shoot goalwards. However, Sam Powell raced back to clear off the line to deny a goal. Celtic managed to hold their line until the 58th minute when Nathan Mathias played Sam Roberts down the left. He cut in and placed the ball past Watkins into the net. The hosts then missed several chances to increase their lead - a header wide from an open goal, a diving save by Watkins, a shot blocked and a clearance off the line before they eventually took the lead in the 78th minute with a carbon copy of their 1st goal, Roberts collecting a long clearance by Kazadi, driving in from the left to rocket his 2nd goal into the net. The Draconians continued to press and Harri Edwards followed up his own free kick to strike on the right bye line to bring a fine save from Watkins. Celtic's woes were complete when skipper Andrew Larcombe was red carded. Running out of defence, he brushed into Harri Edwards who pushed him. Andrew pushed back. It was nothing more than handbags but the referee only saw the last push and decreed that it was a sending off offence which brought congratulations to Edwards from a team-mate. This was Celtic's 12th game without a win. For the recongratuations to cord they have only played 3 games at Celtic Park having played 2 floodlit games on away grounds and they have not won away from Celtic Park since 1st February.


