## WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Celtic play visitors Cardiff Draconians tonight for the 3rd time this season. The newly promoted Draconians entertained Celtic in September in the Welsh Cup. Celtic took the lead 1-0 through a goal by Jac Evans. The hosts pulled back to take the lead before Josh Gibson equalised in the 65<sup>th</sup> minute. Draconians again took the lead, but Celtic missed the opportunity to level again in the 88<sup>th</sup> minute when Evans failed from the penalty spot and Draconians made it 4-2 with a last minute goal.

A fortnight later in the league at Celtic Park, Celtic again took the lead through Josh Gibson but Draconians scored twice in the 2<sup>nd</sup> half to win 2-1.

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2025

Cwmbran Celtic Football Club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/26 there was then a 25-year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/51. The club disbanded in the late 1950s largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but an influx of junior and youth players brought about the re-forming of the club in 1964 under the new name Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/71 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/73 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League. In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/87 they remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/05 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were shared Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/06, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April they travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/07, Celtic, now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost two games and enjoyed a 24-match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With three minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box. He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/08 and 2008/09 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy. In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial

time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after seven years during which he secured three promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won seven and drew three of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first five games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in five seasons in the top tier. In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals. In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With nine new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo. Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21, because of the covid pandemic only one game was played, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup. In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom three and an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In 2022/23 Celtic finished 8<sup>th</sup>. In 2023/24 they finished 10<sup>th</sup>. Alex Botnron won the Cymru South Golden Boot with 30 goals. Last season, in the club's centenary season, under new manager Simon Berry, Celtic lost several key players including Alex Bonthron during the season, but Simon recruited a number of young replacements and the team beat Llantwit Major on the last day of the season to finish 13<sup>th</sup> and avoid relegation.



## MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 1 - 2 TREOWEN STARS (02-Jan)

Cwmbran Celtic's run without a win stretched into the New Year to 19 games when they went down to Gwent rivals Treowen Stars under the Celtic Park floodlights. For the visitors, who fielded 3 ex-Celtic players, centre backs Tommy James and Callum Hodges and striker Tom Meachan, this was their 4<sup>th</sup> successive league win.

The crowd was a Celtic league record 262 spectators, testament to the contribution that floodlit football gives to local football. Chances were few

and far between and it was the Stars who took the lead in the 27<sup>th</sup> minute when a wicked curve on Gavin Meachen's corner sent the ball past the crowded box to the far post



where Tommy James had the simplest of tap ins. Celtic's only chance of the half occurred in the 40<sup>th</sup> minute when, from a corner, they had 3 strikes at goal, but all were half hit and eventually Treowen's veteran keeper Cael Jones gathered the ball to clear.

In the 2<sup>nd</sup> half, on the hour the Stars brought on substitute Macsen Evans and 3 minutes later he put his side 2-0 ahead when, from a corner, Callum Hodges, pulled away from the melee in the goalmouth and back flicked the ball into the 6-yard box where Evans was quickest to react to poke the ball over the line. Celtic brought on substitute Josh Gibson and in the 86<sup>th</sup> minute he pulled a goal back for Celtic. A throw from the right was cleared to Isaac Powell whose measured crossed was met by Gibson whose shot was not hit with any power but it squirmed through the keeper's legs into the net. Celtic pushed to the end and, in the 4<sup>th</sup> minute of time added on, Jones punched a cross clear but it fell to Gibson who shimmied sideways to make room for a shot but, off balance, he screwed his shot wide of the far upright and Treowen survived to take the 3 points.

## MATCH REPORT: CARMARTHEN TOWN 2 - 2 CWMBRAN CELTIC (10-Jan)

Cwmbran Celtic fought back from two goals down to earn a 2-2 draw away at Carmarthen Town on Saturday.

Carmarthen forward Liam Thomas rounded Lewis Watkins and rolled the ball home six minutes before half-time to put his side ahead at the break, before Keyon Reffell then doubled the lead five minutes after the restart with a clinical low finish into the bottom corner.

The hosts were seemingly in control of the contest, but Celtic pulled a goal back through Josh Hinwood on 72 minutes before he turned provider to set up captain Andy Larcombe to equalise in stoppage time.

Seventh-place Carmarthen now sit 10 points behind the promotion spots, while Celtic are seven points adrift of safety but with a game in hand on the three teams above them.

## A BRIEF HISTORY OF CARDIFF DRACONIANS

The Draconians were founded in 1963, receiving special permission to use the Draconians name first used by a Welsh representative side. In their first season in the Cardiff Combination League, they finished as Second Division champions.

The club changed its name to Gabalfa Draconians at about the time that the Llanidloes Road ground was first used for home games (1984-85 season), before reverting to their original name in 2000 when they entered the South Wales Amateur League.

After finishing as runner-up in the South Wales Alliance League Premier Division in 2019-20 and being granted a tier 3 licence by the Football Association of Wales, the club initially failed to gain a place in the new tier 3. However, after the withdrawal and folding of STM Sports, on 3 August 2020 the club was informed that they had been accepted to the new tier 3 Ardal Leagues South West for the 2020-21 season as the highest placed team from the Alliance League who had been awarded a licence.

In their first season in the Ardal South West, the club were runners up in the first Ardal Southern Cup final.

The club finished champions of the Ardal South West in the 2024-25 season and were promoted to the Cymru South (the Welsh second tier) for the first time in their history.
