WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

We welcome Treowen Stars to Celtic Park for our first game of the New Year under our new floodlights. The Stars are newcomers to the Cymru South League, having won the Ardal South-East title last season. They are long-standing rivals of Celtic stretching back to the Gwent County days. They entered the Welsh League in the 1990s, quickly rising to the 1st Division in which they spent 7 seasons rising to 4th place in 2 seasons 1996 to 1998. However, they were relegated in 2000/1 and again in 2001/2 into the 3rd Division and in 2006/7 they finished 17th and were demoted back to the Gwent County League. That was the season when Mickey Copeman's Celtic team did that astonishing Houdini act at Chepstow Town to escape relegation in their debut season by scoring in the 9th minute of time added on whereas Treowen lost against Cwmmaman to a goal in the 10th minute of time added on and then lost both their last 2 games in the last minute to go down. They spent 4 seasons back in the Gwent County before returning to the Welsh League in 2010/11. For 10 seasons they struggled, never finishing in the top 10 but when they joined the newly formed Ardal League in 2021/22 their fortunes improved culminating in their promotion last season.

Celtic have played Treowen 3 times in the Welsh League/Cymru South era. In 2005/6 in Division 3 we did the double, winning 1-0 away through a goal by Michael Archer and in the return at Cwmbran Stadium we heralded the arrival of new coach Della Cheedy with a 4-1 win courtesy of a hat-trick by Shane Williamson and a goal by Dan Rosser. In the Cymru South in September Celtic looked like getting their first win of the season at Treowen, taking a 2-goal interval lead through Jac Evans and Isaac Powell. Isaac then missed a penalty and Finlay Hayman was sent off. Goals in 85 and 90+3 minutes by Gavin Meacham and Jak Lewis rescued a point for the hosts.

This season they are holding their own in the Cymru South, currently in 10th place and on the back of a 3-match winning run. They are top of the unofficial Cymru South Gwent league table in terms of results against Gwent rivals in which Celtic are unbeaten in 2nd place:

The Stars have three ex-Celtic players in their squad. Defender Tommy James played 7 games in 2011/12 as a teenager in his Academy days and those with old memories will remember his spectacular 30-yard goal at Celtic Park against Ton Pentre. Striker/midfielder Tom Meachen made 116 appearances for Celtic and stopper Callum Hodges was with Celtic last season.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2025

Cwmbran Celtic Football Club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/26 there was then a 25-year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/51. The club disbanded in the late 1950s largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but an influx of junior and youth players brought about the re-forming of the club in 1964 under the new name Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/71 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/73 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League. In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/87 they remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/05 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were shared Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/06, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April they travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/07, Celtic, now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost two games and enjoyed a 24-match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With three minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box. He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/08 and 2008/09 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy. In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial

time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after seven years during which he secured three promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won seven and drew three of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first five games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in five seasons in the top tier. In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals. In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With nine new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo. Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21, because of the covid pandemic only one game was played, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup. In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom three and an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In 2022/23 Celtic finished 8th. In 2023/24 they finished 10th. Alex Botnron won the Cymru South Golden Boot with 30 goals. Last season, in the club's centenary season, under new manager Simon Berry, Celtic lost several key players including Alex Bonthron during the season, but Simon recruited a number of young replacements and the team beat Llantwit Major on the last day of the season to finish 13th and avoid relegation.



MATCH REPORT: CWMBRAN CELTIC 0 - 1 BAGLAN DRAGONS (31-Oct)

Cwmbran Celtic extended their run of games without a win to 16 games in their 2nd game under the Celtic Park floodlights. Dylan Thomas scored the only goal of the game in the 6th minute to secure the 3 points for Baglan who ended a run of 8 games without a win in the process. The goal was set up by a determined challenge in midfield by Jonathan Davies who played the ball to Daniel Devey on the left wing. He cut inside and laid the ball across the field to Thomas whose strike from 35 yards rocketed past the upraised hand of Iwan Hooper into the net. In the next 20 minutes it was all Baglan. Legavec brought a diving save from Hooper. Thomas twice shot over the bar and Devey was clean through but placed his shot just wide of Hooper's right post.

The 2nd half started in calamitous fashion for Celtic. Two pass backs were made from the half-way line, the second of which was without realising that Hooper had backed up way out of his goal.



Iwan laid the ball forward to Josh Hinwood who found himself ambushed by two attackers. The ball was taken from him and the resultant first time strike sailed a whisker wide of the post. Celtic's first chance on goal was in the 64th minute when Hinwood floated a measured ball down the left flank to Jac Evans who crossed to Josh Gibson whose left foot shot on goal was stopped by keeper Ryan's foot.

The video recording died after this action and Baglan went on to win the match despite the sending off of Jordan Pike in the 72nd minute. Celtic are now in danger of becoming isolated at the bottom of the table. On current form one of Ynyshir and Celtic looks set for the one relegation spot. The two teams meet on 29 November at Ynyshir for what is going to be a massive 6-pointer.

Andrew Larcombe hit the post with his spot kick and the ball was cleared for a corner. This was Celtic's 4th penalty miss of the season in addition to having lost on penalties in two cup competitions. Next match up for Celtic is against Cardiff Draconians who are in 6th position, managed by ex-Celtic player Nana Baah.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF TREOWEN STARS

Treowen Stars F.C. are a Welsh football club from the village of Treowen near Newbridge, Caerphilly. The club plays in the Cymru South.

Treowen Stars were formed in 1926 in the village of Treowen, near Newbridge, and played most of their early football in the Abertillery & District and West Monmouthshire Leagues. It was in the early 70's under the chairmanship of Archie Davies that Treowen by now in the Monmouthshire Senior League planted the seeds of success. In 1973, new changing rooms were erected just below the field, at Bush Park, largely paid for with proceeds of a very successful Tote, run by the Committee at the time. It wasn't until 1984 that the club was given licence to sell alcohol on the premises. It didn't take long though to reconstruct the inside of the building, since a very strong social element had been very instrumental in keeping the club going financially.

In 1980 the Gwent County League had been formed from a merger of the Monmouthshire Senior League and the Gwent Premier League. In 1985–86, Treowen Stars won promotion from Division 3 of the Gwent County League and started the climb up the ladder. In 1990–91, Treowen gained promotion from Division 2 and a year later clinched the Division 1 title at the first attempt. This was at the time of the introduction of the Pyramid system and Treowen were offered a place in the Welsh League. Within weeks the required ground improvements were completed and Treowen entered the Welsh League.

In 1992–93, the clubs first season in the Welsh League, the Stars won Division 3 by March, winning 21 and drawing 4 of the 26 league games. The following year Treowen won promotion again, this time finishing runners-up, losing out on goal difference to Taffs Well. In the same season, 1993–94 they also finished runners-up in the Welsh League Cup losing to Barry Town at Coychurch Road, Bridgend.

The next four seasons from 1994 to 1998 would see Treowen Stars become an established top six Welsh League Division 1 side, finishing in 6th, 5th, 4th & 4th positions respectively. The club also won the Welsh League Cup in 1998, 4–3 after extra time against BP Llandarcy once again in Bridgend. While between 1997 and 2003 the club would reach the last 32 of the Welsh Cup on 4 occasions. However, the club also suffered relegation consecutively in 2000–01 and 2001–02.

Three seasons of top 10 finishes followed in Division 3 before Treowen Stars were relegated from the Welsh League at the end of 2005–06 to the Gwent County, losing out by just a point to Cwmbran Celtic and Llantwit Fardre. However, the club bounced back in 2009–10 winning Gwent County Division 1 with a return to the Welsh League Division 3 the reward. This is where the club remained until the pyramid restructuring in 2019–20, saw Treowen Stars compete in the final season of Welsh League Division 2, where they finished in 13th place on the points per game average due to the pandemic. In 2020–21 Treowen Stars took their place in the newly structured Ardal South East league where they finished 7th, followed by a 6th place and a 10th placed finish. In the summer of 2024 Ben Murphy was appointed as first team manager and the club have high aspirations for the season.

The club now have an active junior section with teams from Under 6's to youth level, both boys and girls and are currently fundraising to improve facilities at Bush Park, one of the most characteristic grounds in Wales with 54 steps up to the pitch.

MATCH REPORT: NEWPORT CITY 2 - 2 CWMBRAN CELTIC (27-Dec)

For the second time this season, Celtic defied the odds by holding Gwent's leading Cymru South side Newport City to a draw at Newport Stadium in front of a good holiday crowd of 280. City started the stronger having the majority of the possession without creating any meaningful chances. However, the deadlock was broken in the 26th minute when a mix-up in the Celtic defence resulted in the ball falling to Kavanagh who made no mistake to put his side 1–0 ahead. Celtic started to get into the game getting more possession. A couple of crosses and a good chance fell to Jac Evans who headed over the bar. Then, in the 39th minute, a penetrating cross from Cole Doolan was met by City defender Lathan Garrett whose misplaced headed flew into the top corner of his own net to level the scores at half time.


Celtic started the 2nd half the stronger and in the 58th minute were awarded a penalty which Mario van Dieren put away with aplomb to put Celtic 2–1 ahead. There followed end to end exchanges until City levelled the scores in the 78th minute, Kyran Steadman scoring from a well-worked corner. Both teams strived for the winner but the game ended at 2–2. Celtic deserved their point. They raise their game against Gwent opposition, this being their 4th draw against the Gwent triumvirate in the Cymru South. Kian Bodenham was man of the match in his first start – his 2nd match award in his 3 games since his return from over a year out injured.
