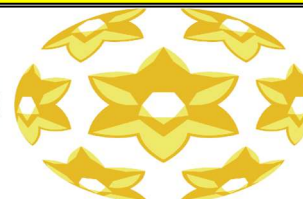

WELCOME TO CELTIC PARK

Tonight's game against Afan Lido was supposed to be Celtic's first game under their new floodlights. However, the club has discovered that its planning permission from Torfaen Council ludicrously does not allow any football under lights until November. Consequently, the game has had to be transferred at short notice to the USW ground at Pontypridd which will cost the club home advantage and circa £1,000 in pitch hire, travel costs and lost income at the gate. Celtic and Afan Lido did just enough to escape relegation last season and they are both already in the doldrums in the new season, occupying the bottom 2 places with no points and no goals scored. Celtic have played Afan Lido 20 times in Welsh/Cymru Leagues & cups. In 2010/11, Celtic's 1st season in Division 1, we drew 1-1 at Afan Lido, Craig Cheedy scoring a 2nd half equaliser. We lost 1-2 at Celtic Park, Joey Carless scoring Celtic's consolation goal. In 2016-7, under the Marston Stadium floodlights Afan Lido easily won 4-0 courtesy of a hat-trick from winger Chris Hartland. Lido arrived at Celtic Park the following March on the back of a run of 10 games with just one win two draws & seven defeats and Celtic added to their misery with a 6-0 thrashing. Josh Bull scored a hat-trick. Callum Wakeham, Lee Penry & Dominic Connor added the other goals in Lee Challenger's first game as permanent manager following the departure of Dean Morris.

In 2017-8 it was Celtic's turn to take a beating, a 5-0 thrashing in the away game with striker Mark Jones scoring a hat-trick during a 5 goal mid-game blitz in 37 minutes. The Celtic match report stated this was Celtic's worst display for many a season. In the return at Celtic Park Lido completed the double with a 2-1 win. Chris Ham scored Celtic's goal, his 6th in successive games. In 2018/19 Celtic travelled to the Marston Stadium the week after Lido's shock 3-2 Welsh Cup defeat at Cwmbran Town but Lido raised their game and easily beat a very poor Celtic side 4-0 with Chris Hartland scoring 2 goals as a 2nd half substitute. To add to Celtic's woes Lewis Ellis was sent off. In the return at Celtic Park the teams fought out a barnstorming game. Lido held a 3-0 interval lead but Celtic fought back in the 2nd half to lead 4-3 before Lido snatched a point with a late penalty.

In 2019/20 a new-look Celtic under Nicky Morgan registered a superb 1-0 win at Lido in the first round of the Nathaniel MG Cup, their first ever win at the Marston, Zac Osborne scoring on his debut. The away league game in October resulted in a 1-1 draw, Chris Ham scoring for Celtic. In 2021/22 Celtic got off to a great start to their campaign with a 3-0 win in the 1st round of the MG League Cup. All the goals came in the 1st half through Tom Meachen 2 and Lewis Iles. Afan Lido got their revenge in the league at the Marston with an emphatic 5-2 win, Lewis Iles scoring both Celtic goals. In the return at Celtic Park Lido thrashed Celtic 5-0. In 2022/23 in the MG Cup at the Marston Lido notched another 5 goals winning 5-2, Alex McDowell and Iles scoring for Celtic. Lido did the double in the league winning 4-1 at Celtic Park, Alex Bonthron scoring for Celtic, and coming from behind to a Tom Meechan goal to win 2-1 at the Marston. In 2023/24 Lido again came from behind at the Marston to win 2-1, Alex Bonthron scoring Celtic's goal. Celtic won the return at Celtic Park 2-0 with goals by Bonthron and Meechan. Last season Lido were comfortable home winners 4-1, their 5th successive home win against Celtic. Meechan scored Celtic's goal. In the return the game was drawn 1-1. Gabriel Howells scored for Celtic and Lido snatched the draw with a last-minute penalty.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF CWMBRAN CELTIC 1925-2025

Cwmbran Celtic Football Club was formed in 1925. In the early years the club was known as CYMS (Catholic Young Men's Society). After the immediate success of winning the Newport & District Division 2 Section A title in 1925/26 there was then a 25-year gap before the next trophy, the Premier Division title in 1950/51. The club disbanded in the late 1950s largely as a consequence of national service call-ups but an influx of junior and youth players brought about the re-forming of the club in 1964 under the new name Cwmbran Catholics. In 1970/71 Celtic won the Gwent Senior Cup. In 1972/73 with playing membership open to all denominations the club dropped the catholic title and re-named as Cwmbran Celtic winning the Gwent Amateur Cup and finishing runners-up in the Gwent Premier League. In 1979 the club bought its own premises at Oak Street, Old Cwmbran, the club's present headquarters. The club's ground was in Cwmbran Park but around 1995 they moved to the grounds outside Cwmbran Stadium which were shared with Cwmbran Cricket club. The cricket club later moved to Caerleon and Celtic obtained the lease from Torfaen Council.

Celtic played in the Gwent County League in the 1980s and 1990s and after gaining promotion as champions of Division 2 in 1986/87 they remained in the 1st division for the next 10 seasons. However a disastrous slide found the club languishing in the 3rd division when Paul "Dishy" Richardson became manager in 1999. He transformed the side bringing in experienced ex-Cwmbran Town stalwarts Mickey Copeman and Kevin Payne alongside teenage striker Shane Williamson who for a dozen seasons was top scorer. The side was later bolstered by the return of ex-professionals Ben Graham and Mark Parfitt who had started their careers with Celtic as juniors. There were successive promotions from the 3rd to 1st division between 1999 and 2001 and in 1999/2000 Celtic won the Gwent County league cup.

In 2004/05 under new player-manager Mickey Copeman, the club were runners-up to Clydach Wasps who applied for membership of the Welsh Football League but their ground was adjudged to be not of the required standard. Celtic applied instead. Their ground was also not up to standard but they were shared Cwmbran Stadium with Cwmbran Town and the Welsh League accepted the club's application.

In their first season in the WFL, 2005/06, Celtic struggled near the bottom of the 3rd division all season. In April they travelled to Chepstow Town needing a win to stay in the league. They went 1-0 down. With minutes of normal time remaining substitute Jason Price equalised but a draw was not enough. In the 9th minute of time added on player manager Mickey Copeman went up for a corner. The ball was cleared off the goal-line by a Chepstow defender, it hit Copeman on the back and rebounded into the net. Celtic had achieved a last gasp win and, by winning their final match against Seven Sisters, Celtic escaped relegation on goal difference.

The following season, 2006/07, Celtic, now back at their upgraded and newly named ground, Celtic Park, were transformed. They only lost two games and enjoyed a 24-match unbeaten run. They went to Risca for their last match already promoted but needed to win to secure the Championship ahead of Llanwern. With three minutes left Celtic were 1-0 down playing with 10 men after a red card for Kevin Payne. Then Sammy Winter equalised with a speculative long range shot and in the last minute a Risca clearance found full back Ben Graham outside the box. He hit a perfect looping volley over the goalkeeper's head and into the net. Celtic were champions.

In Division 2 Celtic consolidated their position in 2007/08 and 2008/09 during which they introduced a number of players from their new partnership with Fairwater High School Football Academy in Cwmbran managed by Celtic coach Della Cheedy. In 2009/10 Celtic were front runners destined to win the Championship. However they lost two key defenders at a crucial

time and vital points were dropped. Nevertheless Celtic finished their games in 1st place and would win the title if Penrhiwceiber failed to win at Newcastle Emlyn. The home side was 2-0 up at one stage but Ceiber clawed their way back to win 3-2 and deny Celtic the championship. At the end of the season Mickey Copeman stood down after seven years during which he secured three promotions which took the club from Gwent County League to the top division of the Welsh League.

In their first season in the 1st division, 2010/11 under new manager Ben Graham, Celtic struggled for much of the season and were firmly planted in the relegation zone but a superb run-in during which they won seven and drew three of 14 games earned them 12th place out of 16. In 2011/12 a good start was made under Alan Dibble who stepped down in September with the team in 5th place, to be replaced by Gareth Morgan. Either side of Christmas, Celtic were 2nd but they had a dismal end of season run and again finished 12th.

In 2012/13 with head coach Della Cheedy at the helm, Celtic started brightly with some fine performances including a 4-2 win versus reigning champions Cambrian & Clydach but they lost their way in the New year and at one stage were in last place. However, with characteristic determination they dragged themselves up the table and sealed another season in the top division with a resounding 5-1 win against Haverfordwest County. Under Steve Morgan in 2013/14 Celtic underperformed finishing 4th from bottom and with Afan Lido relegated from the Welsh Premier League, Celtic were relegated despite appealing to an FAW arbitration. With Della Cheedy back as manager in 2014/15 Celtic finished 7th in Division 2.

In 2015/16 Nicky Church started as manager but he resigned mid-season. Ex Ton Pentre boss Dean Morris took over, won two manager of the month awards, and guided Celtic to the runners-up position and promotion on the back of 10 straight wins. The club also reached the quarter finals of the Welsh Cup, going down 2-1 after a brave fight at home to WPL side Port Talbot. Josh Bull was the Welsh League's top scorer with 32 league goals.

In 2016/17, back in the 1st Division, Celtic went top of the league early in the season. Dean Morris resigned in March 2017 and first teamer Lee Challenger took over, winning his first five games in charge as the team ended in 6th place, their best position in five seasons in the top tier. In 2017/18 Celtic finished 8th in the league and enjoyed their best ever league cup run, reaching the semi-final before losing to Llanelli Town 3-0. Chris Ham was Welsh Division 1 player of the season and top scorer with 28 league goals. In 2018/19 Celtic finished a disappointing 10th in the League with Lee Challenger resigning in March 2019.

In 2019/20, for the inaugural season of the Cymru League South, Celtic installed Nicky Morgan and Simon Truman as the management team. With nine new signings there was a lot of optimism for a successful season but the team never got going and after a 6-1 drubbing at Pontypridd in January the club regretfully dismissed the management duo. Development team manager James Kinsella took over with Matthew Williams as assistant, the team finishing 13th in a curtailed season due to the pandemic.

In 2020/21, because of the covid pandemic only one game was played, a 2-0 defeat at Pontypridd Town in the Nathaniel MG League cup. In 2021/22 having lost key players, Celtic were involved in a basement battle to avoid relegation. Four successive wins late on took them out of the bottom three and an equaliser in time added on by Andrew Hewitt saved Celtic and took opponents Risca United down into the Ardal League. In 2022/23 Celtic finished 8th. In 2023/24 they finished 10th Alex Botnrhon won the Cymru South Golden Boot with 30 goals. Last season, in the club's centenary season, under new manager Simon Berry, Celtic lost several key players including Alex Bonthron during the season, but Simon recruited a number of young replacements and the team beat Llantwit Major on the last day of the season to finish 13th and avoid relegation.

Kian Bodenham: right back, age 20. Joined from Barry Town U. Former club: Goytre. Missed most of last season with serious leg injury. Brother Jack plays professional for The New Saints. Father Paul played for Celtic Juniors & 1st team in Gwent County. Debut: Taffs Well Jul 22. **[69/1]**

Tyler Broom: right back, age 27. Product of Torfaen Academy. Former clubs: Fairfield, Cwmffrwdor, Monmouth T, Risca U. Gwent County U16 cap 2014. Missed most of last season with serious leg injury. Debut: Ammanford Aug 21. **[62/2]**

Dominic Connor: left wing/back, age 38. Elder statesman of the team. Signed from Caldicot T 2011/12. Former clubs: Chepstow T, Garden City juniors. Top scorer 2014/15 with 14 goals. Debut: AFC Porth Oct 11 scoring the only goal. **[292/40]**

Luke Edwards: right back, age 26. Signed this season. Former clubs: Rogerstone AFC, Albion Rovers, Sifil. Debut: Jul 25 Pontypridd U.

Jac Evans: left back, age 19. Signed this season. Former club: Goytre.

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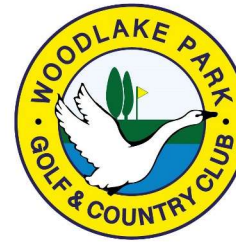

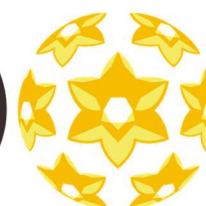
